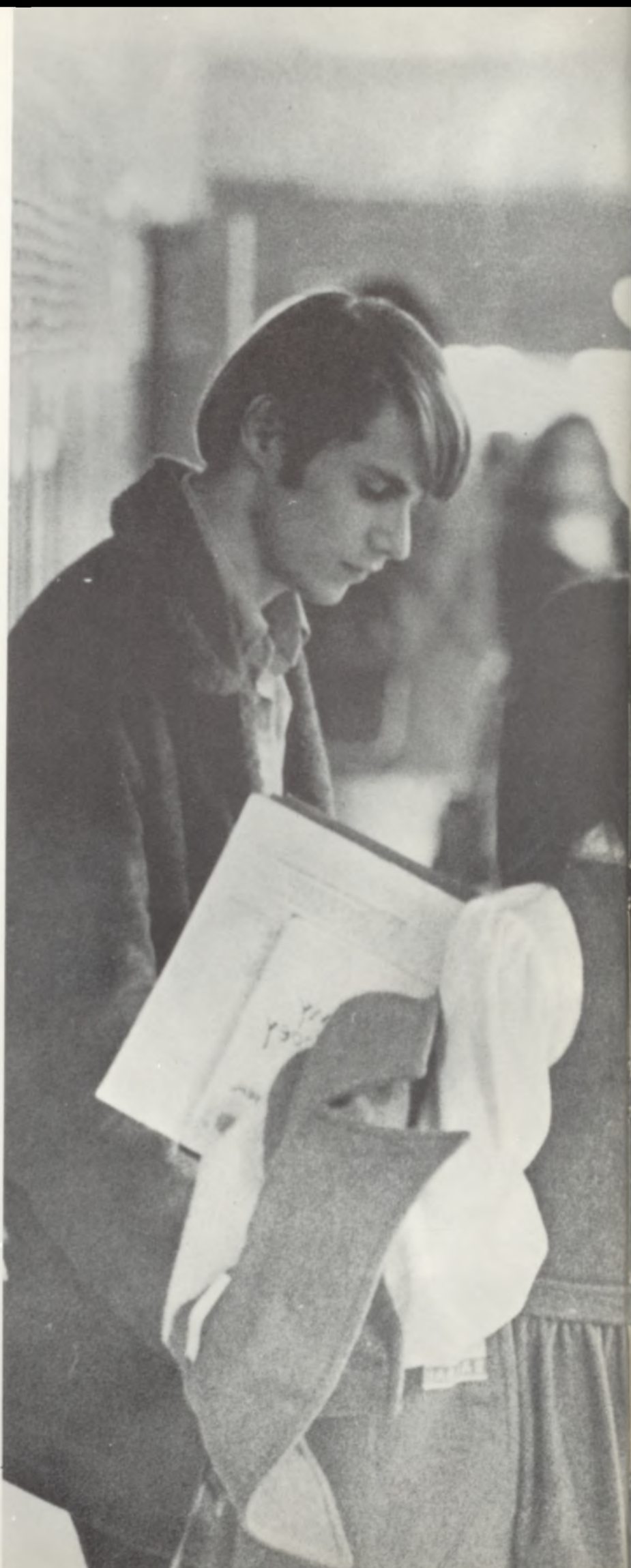








Through participation in these activities, students acquired understanding and appreciation for others' viewpoints. But most of all they enjoyed just being together.

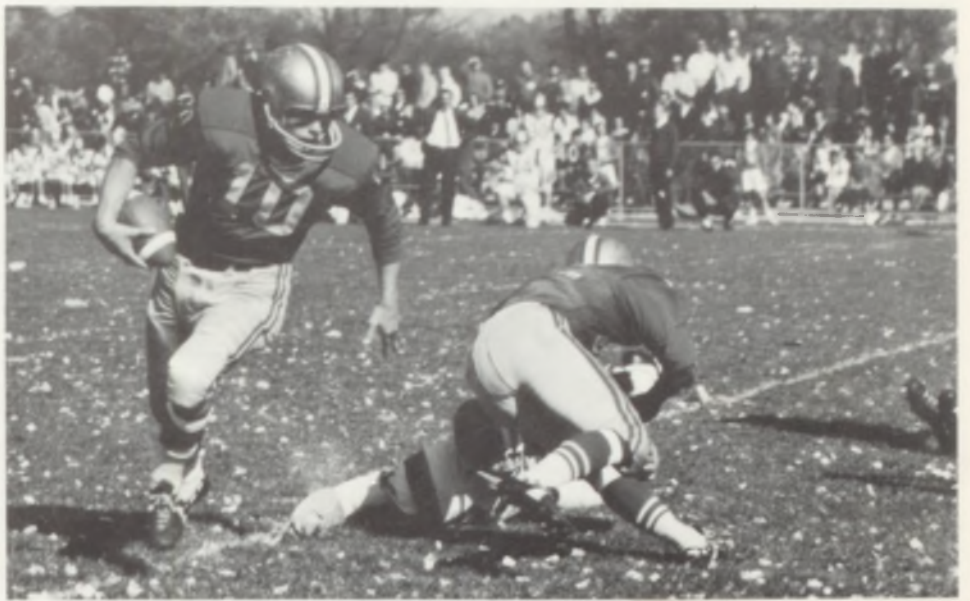

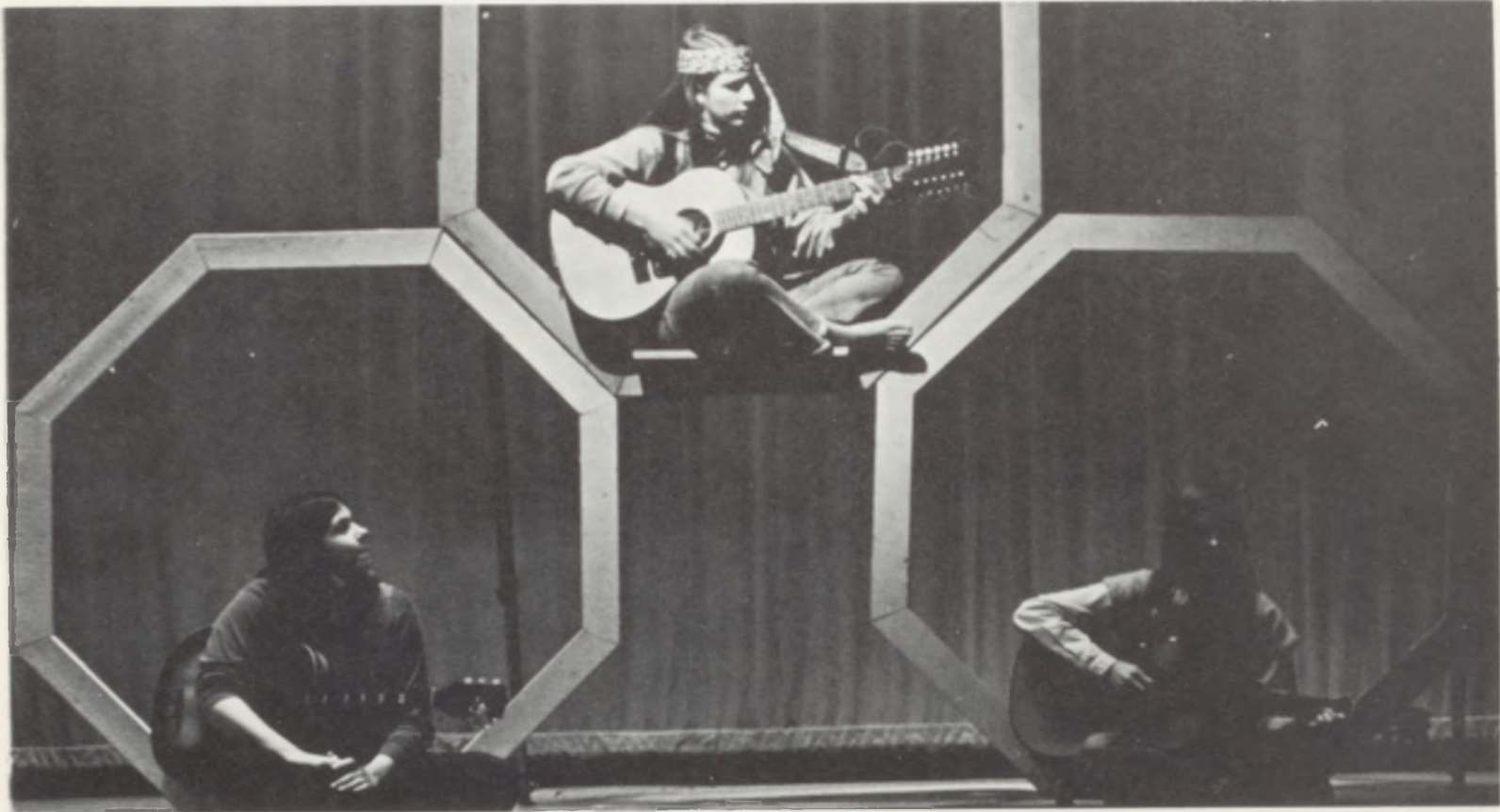

Standing Ovation Climaxes 'The Human Race'

Student Stunts 1968 was heralded by the advance sale of colorful buttons and bumper stickers. The first Stunts to run three nights, "The Human Race" presented humorous glimpses of many types of people. Detectives from Scotland Yard and American hippies were some of the groups portrayed in the show. A couple of American Indians were interviewed, and six fluorescent skeletons danced to an African beat. After months of planning and rehearsals, director Chuck Mitchell and the thirteen member board presented a show more creative than any seen before.

Unique to Stunts 1968 was the original music. The theme song, as well as several other numbers were written especially for the show.

The use of mixed media added to the success of the production. Strobes, slides, and films were combined to produce a kaleidoscopic effect. A special film incorporating new photographic techniques opened the show. Even the dance numbers were augmented by a variety of lighting effects.

After playing to three full houses, the cast and crew were rewarded for their endeavors by a thrilling standing ovation.

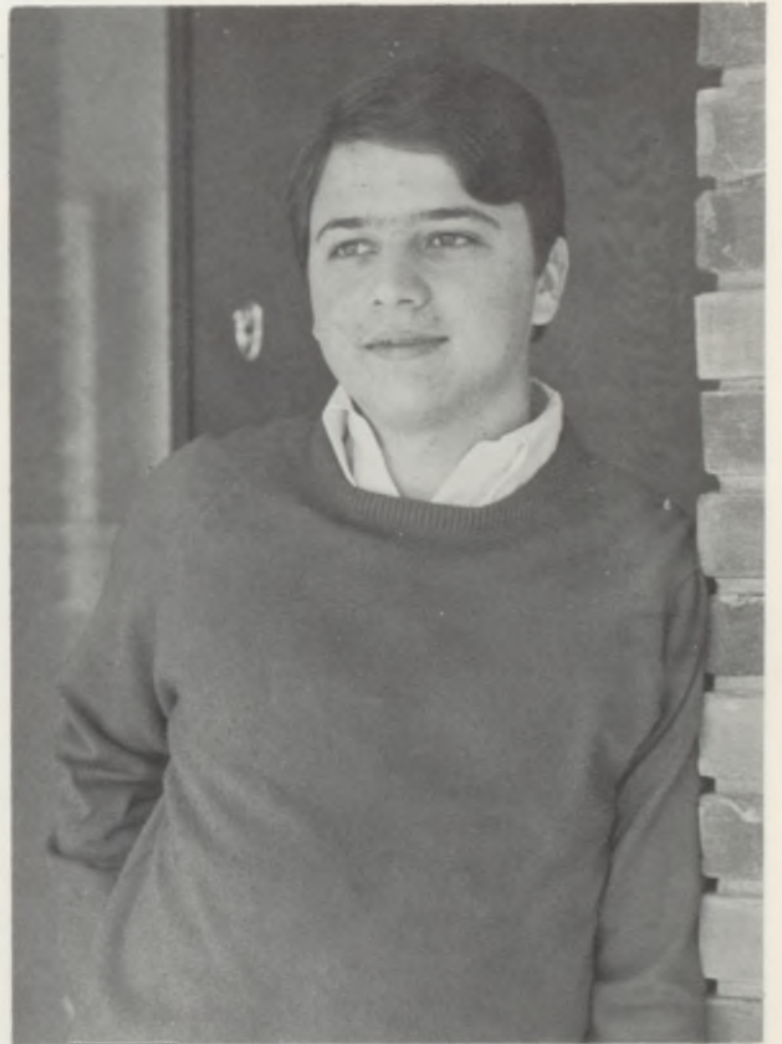

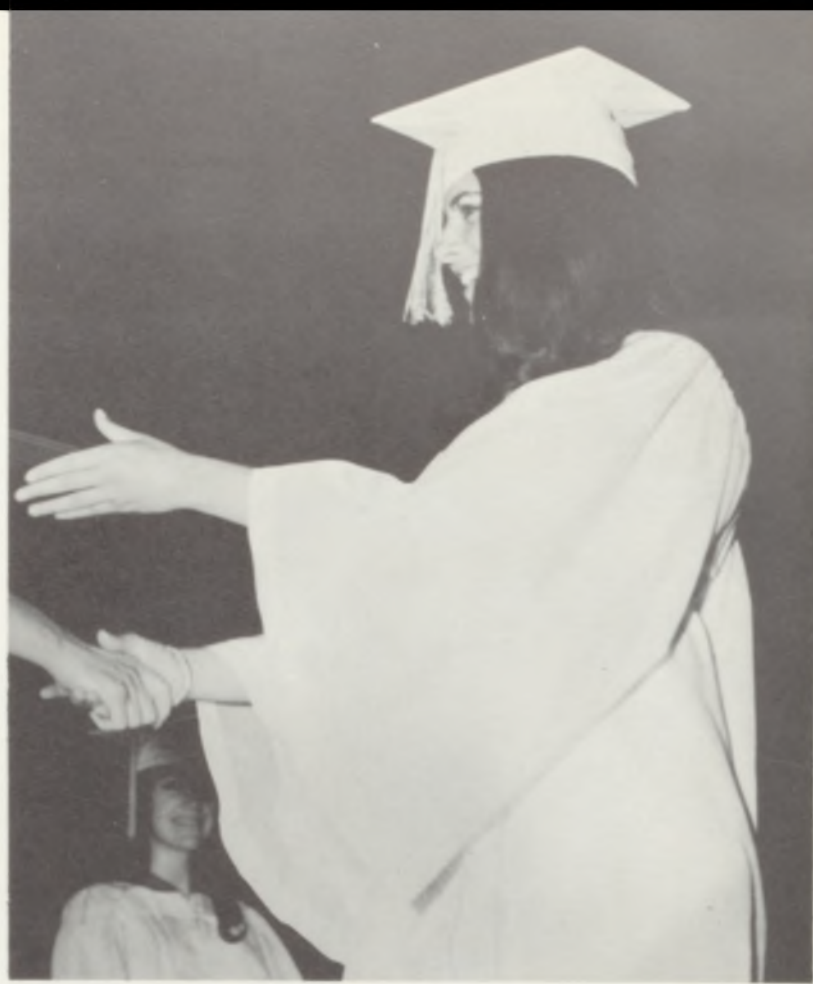
Improvisation and Music Featured in Dance Show

Graduates Receive Diplomas at Ravinia Ceremonies

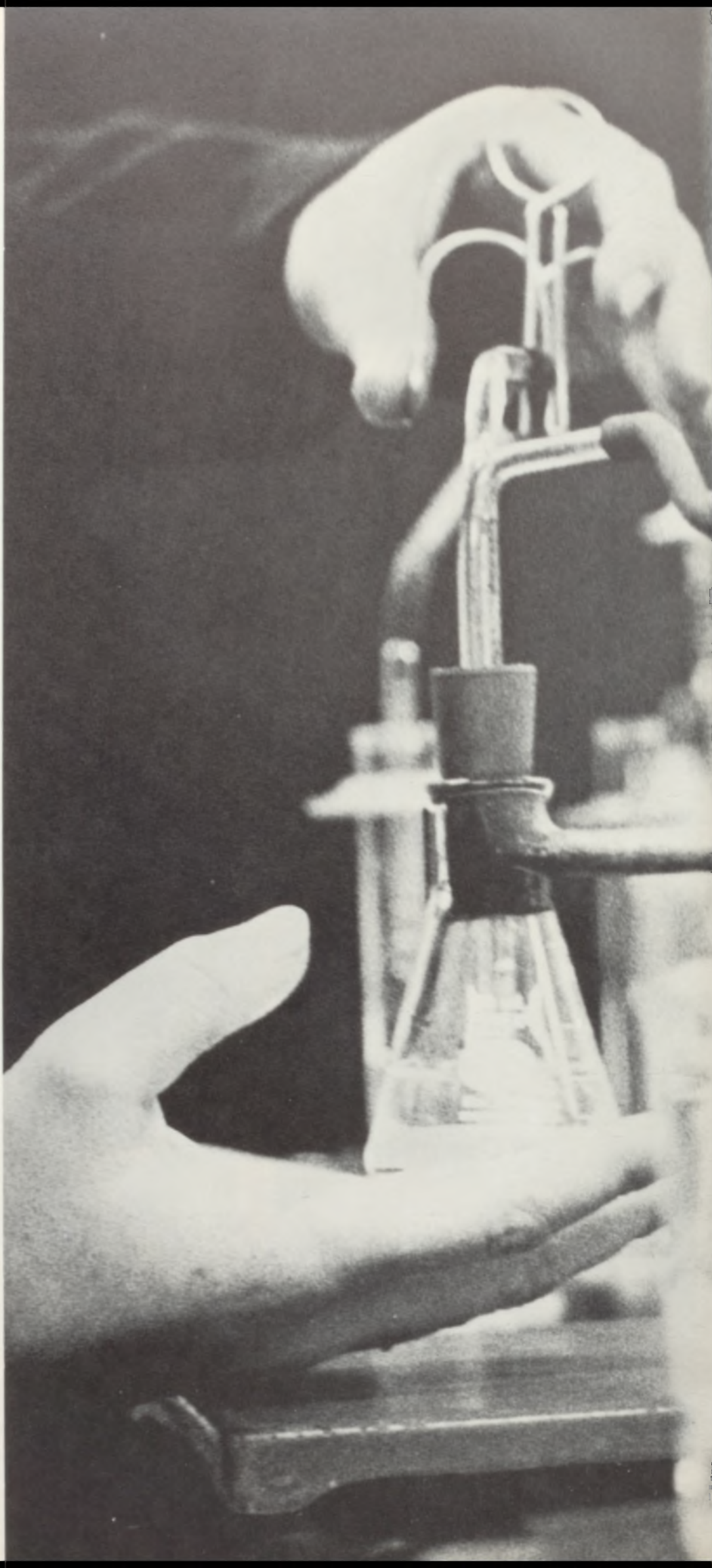

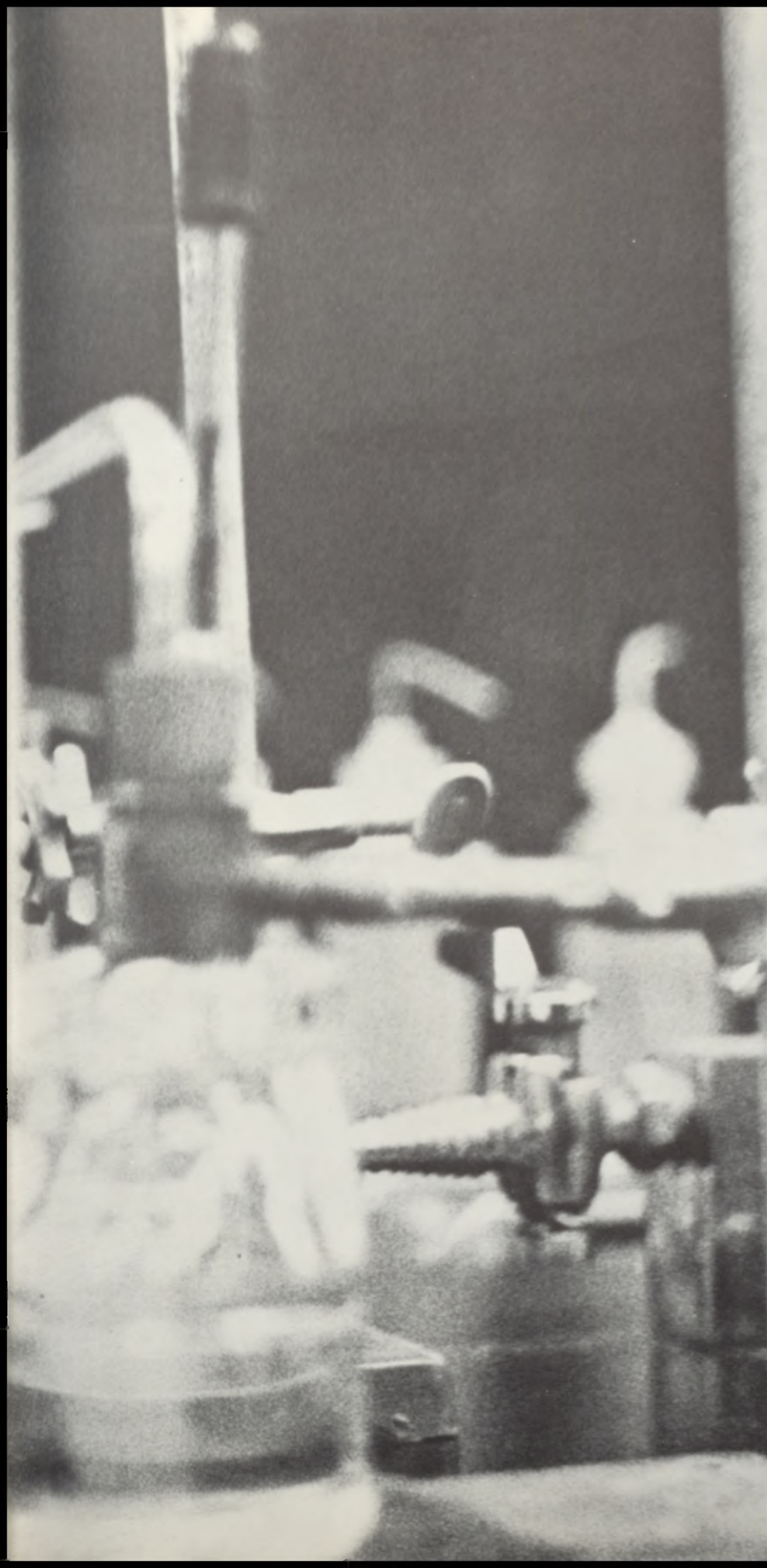


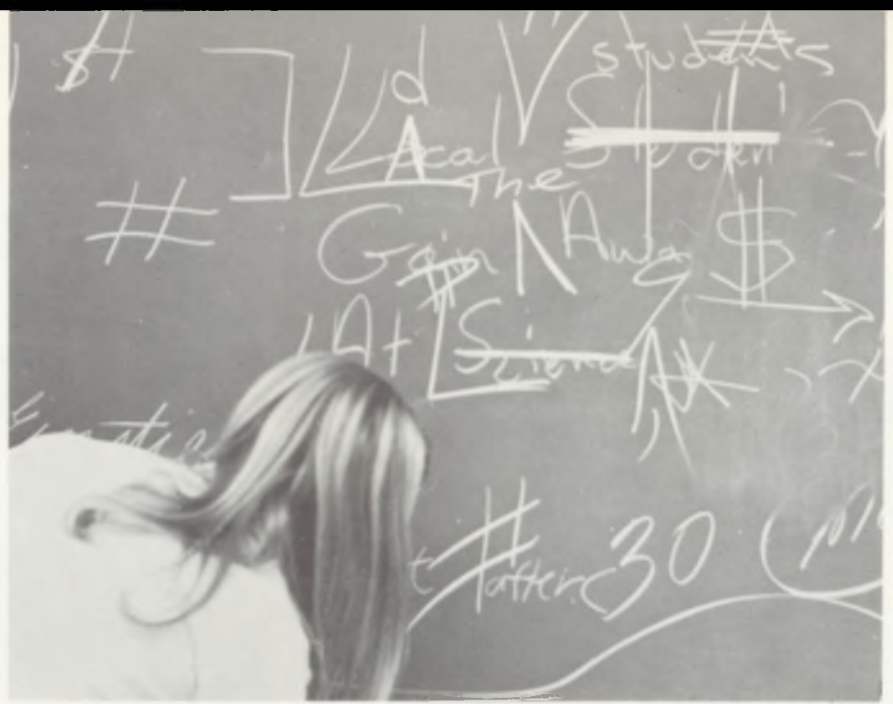

Language, government and drama students applied their learning on European tours which were organized and chaperoned by faculty members.

Continuous growth and enlargement of facilities increased the duties of the district administrators. New administrative posts were created to help coordinate the expanding activities at both Deerfield and Highland Park High Schools. The seven administrators worked in their headquarters in the administration building in Highland Park. They guided school policies and made important decisions concerning curriculum.

Administration Serves to Coordinate School Affairs

The four-member administrative staff worked closely with the Board of Education to coordinate the various functions of faculty and students. Three main areas of concern were administrative services, pupil personnel services and curriculum and instruction services.

Providing special help for the individual student was the goal of the Instructional Materials Center. Instead of doing all the work for the students, librarians concentrated on teaching students how

to use the materials themselves. Concerned with maintaining a quiet study atmosphere, the library continued the practice of issuing passes.

The amount of information on contemporary issues such as civil disorders and drugs was significantly increased this year. The staff worked to keep the vertical file up to date, weeding out the old material and purchasing new. Periodicals were also used to a greater extent as sources for more timely information.

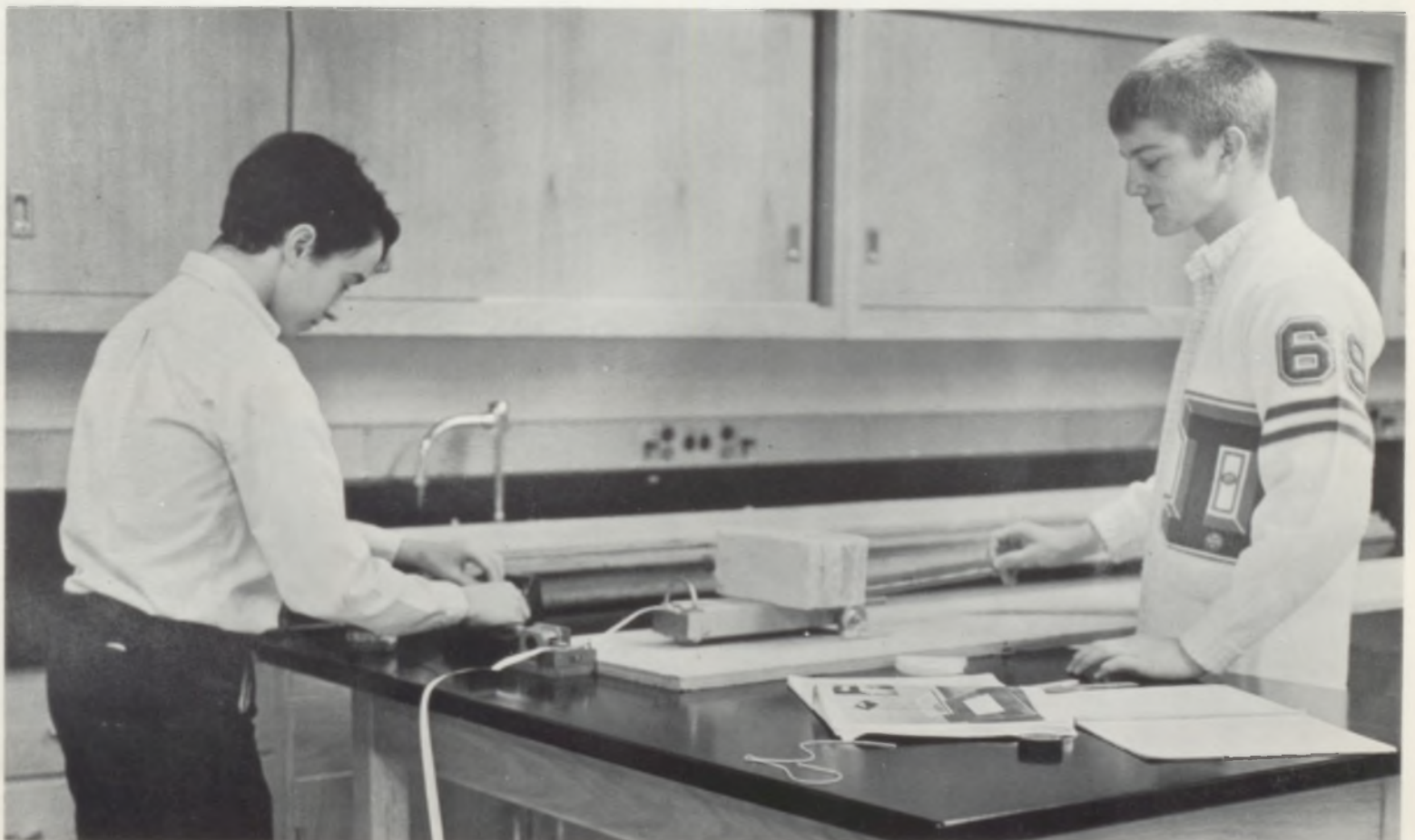

Stimulating Field Trips Deepen Students' Interest

Visits to the Museum of Contemporary Art, the opera, a synogogue and several churches in the area were field-trip activities for Humanities students searching for an overall view of man's accomplishments. Three teachers planned a curriculum that integrated the many aspects of the humanities and presented a variety of ideas and art forms.

Students concentrated on how the broad concepts of Man, God, Nature and Society have been expressed through philosophy, art, music and literature. They discovered the influence of Renais-

sance music on modern folk songs. "Prometheus Bound" and "Death of a Salesman" were compared as students surveyed the entire history of man.

Course organization was as varied as its scope. The class met seven periods a week, allowing for small group discussions and lectures. Individual projects such as composing music, creating small sculptures and writing term papers on Freud were evidence that students not only learned about humanities but also discovered their own potential.

Final projects in music demand the strict concentration of Laurie Lindsey and Allyson Hedrick.

Overhead Labs Improve Pronunciation Techniques

The newest acquisition of the modern Home Economics kitchen was a self-cleaning oven. Appliances like this kept the girls up to date on the most modern kitchen facilities.

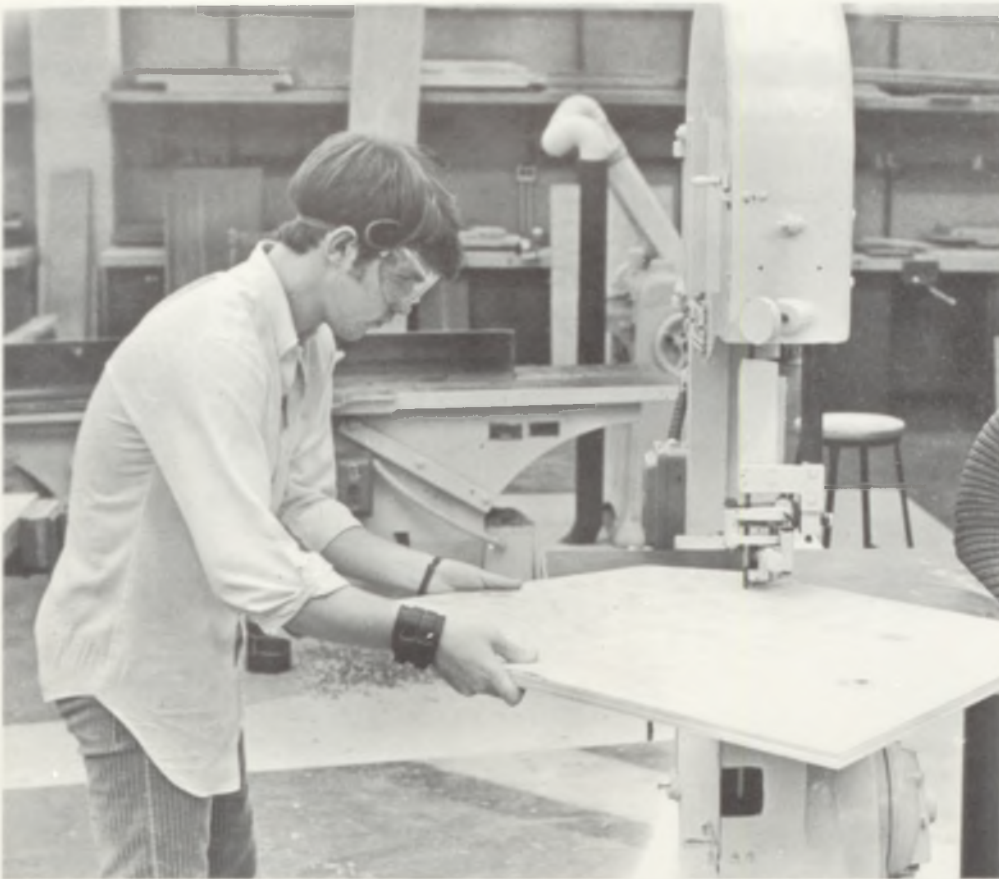
Industrial Arts Community Training is Organized

An expanded power mechanics course provided more detailed analysis of engines and their functions. Originally available for only one semester, the course is now offered for a year. The first semester deals with the theory of power mechanics as well as a study of small engines. The second semester allows students to investigate the workings of a diesel engine, not covered in the previous course.

A new program was planned by the Industrial

Arts Department which will begin next year. This program, an industrial arts cooperative education plan, will allow students to go out into the community and practice a trade. Positions as mechanics, supervisors, telephone operators, and technicians will be available. These opportunities will increase a student's awareness of the demands he will face in such professions and will give practical values to techniques learned in class.

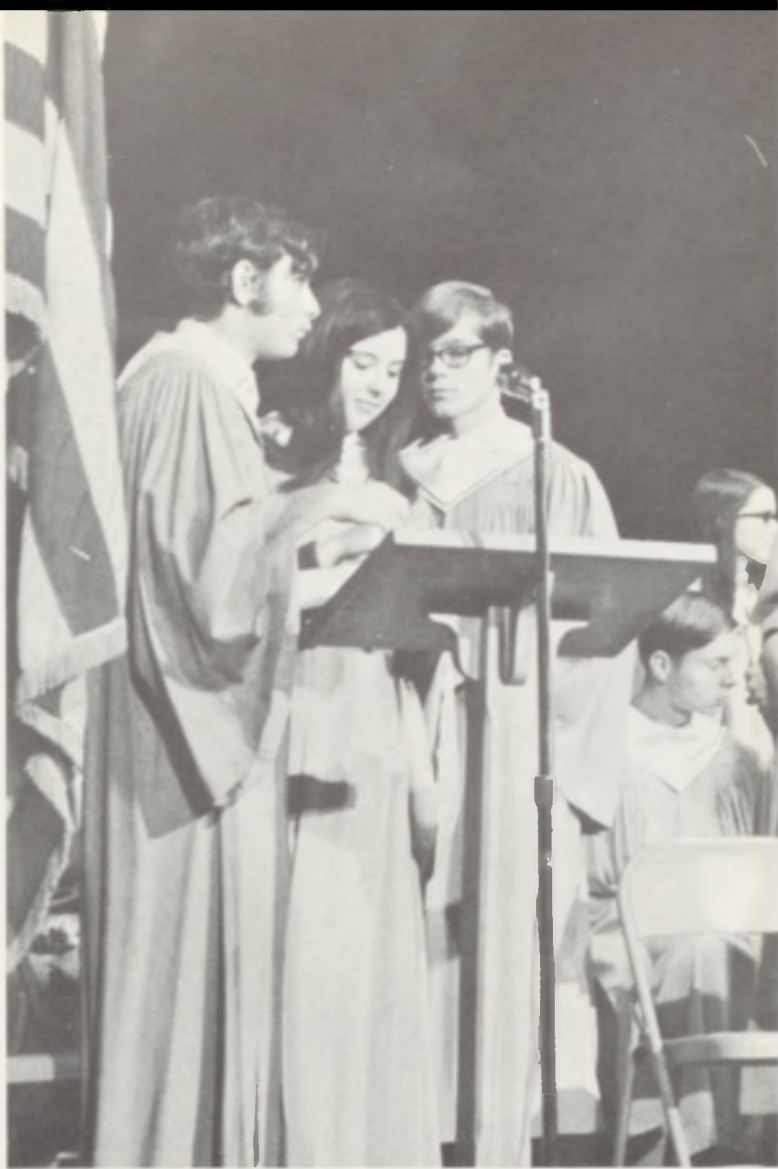

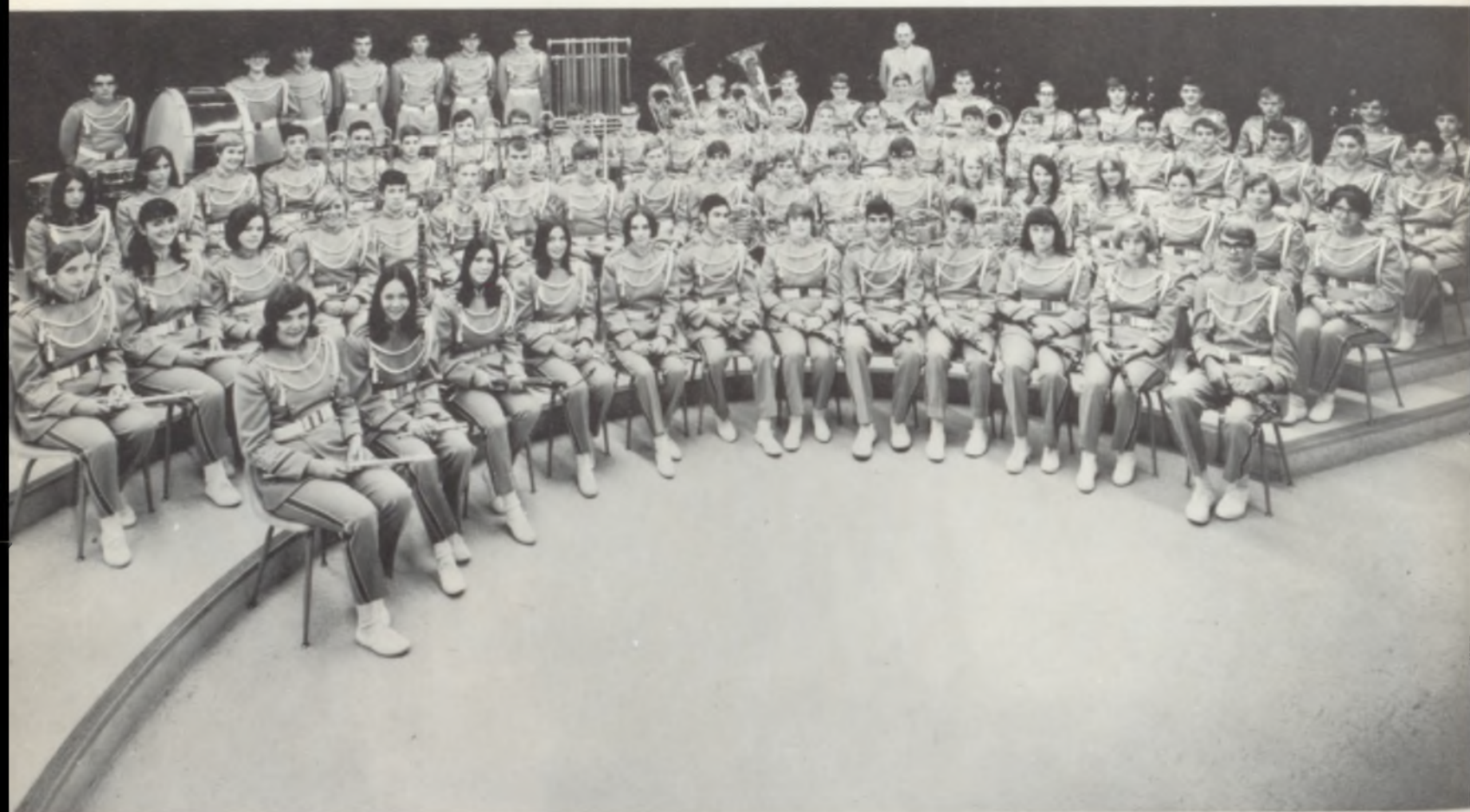
Marching Warriors at Away Game for First Time

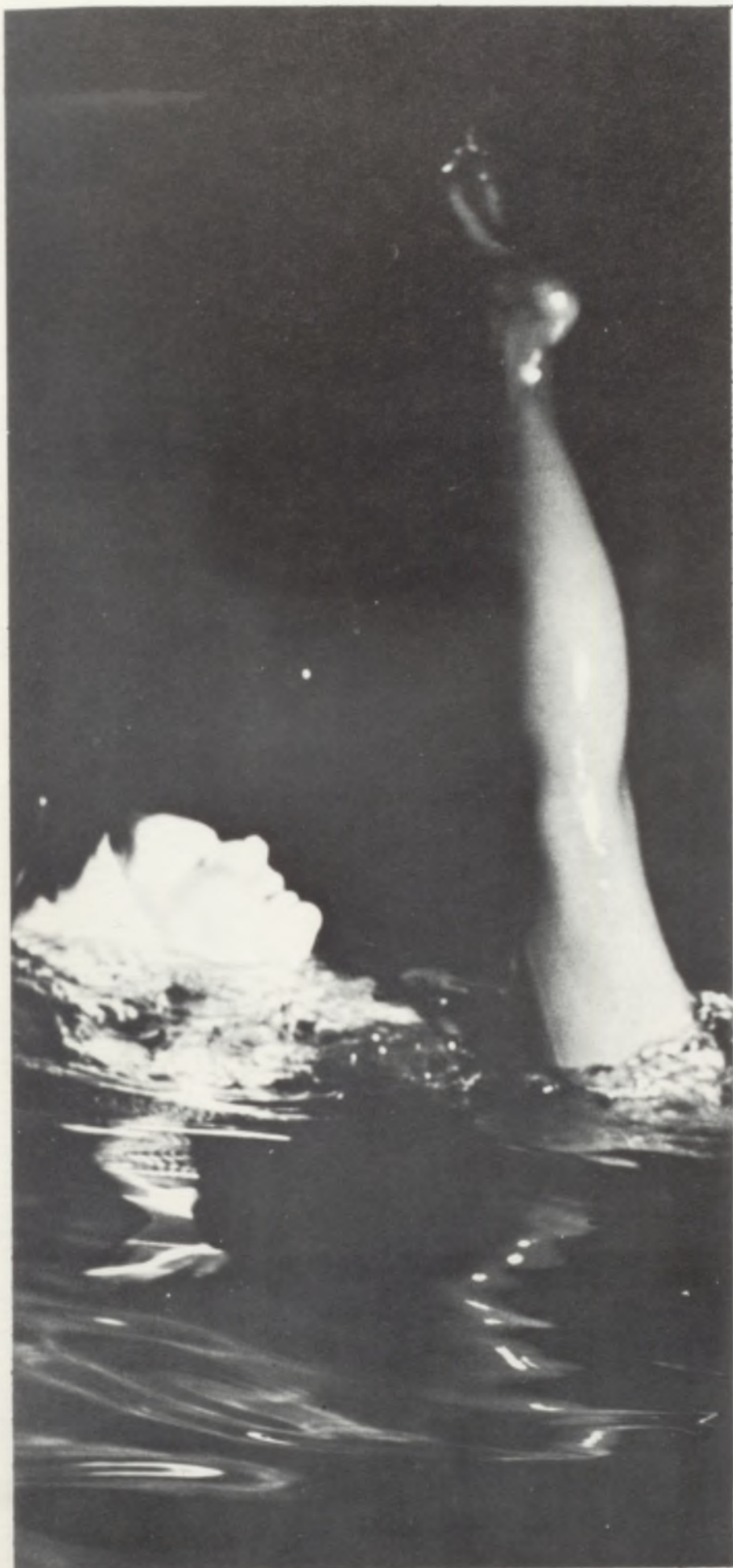
GIMA Sponsors Turnabout, Awards Scholarships

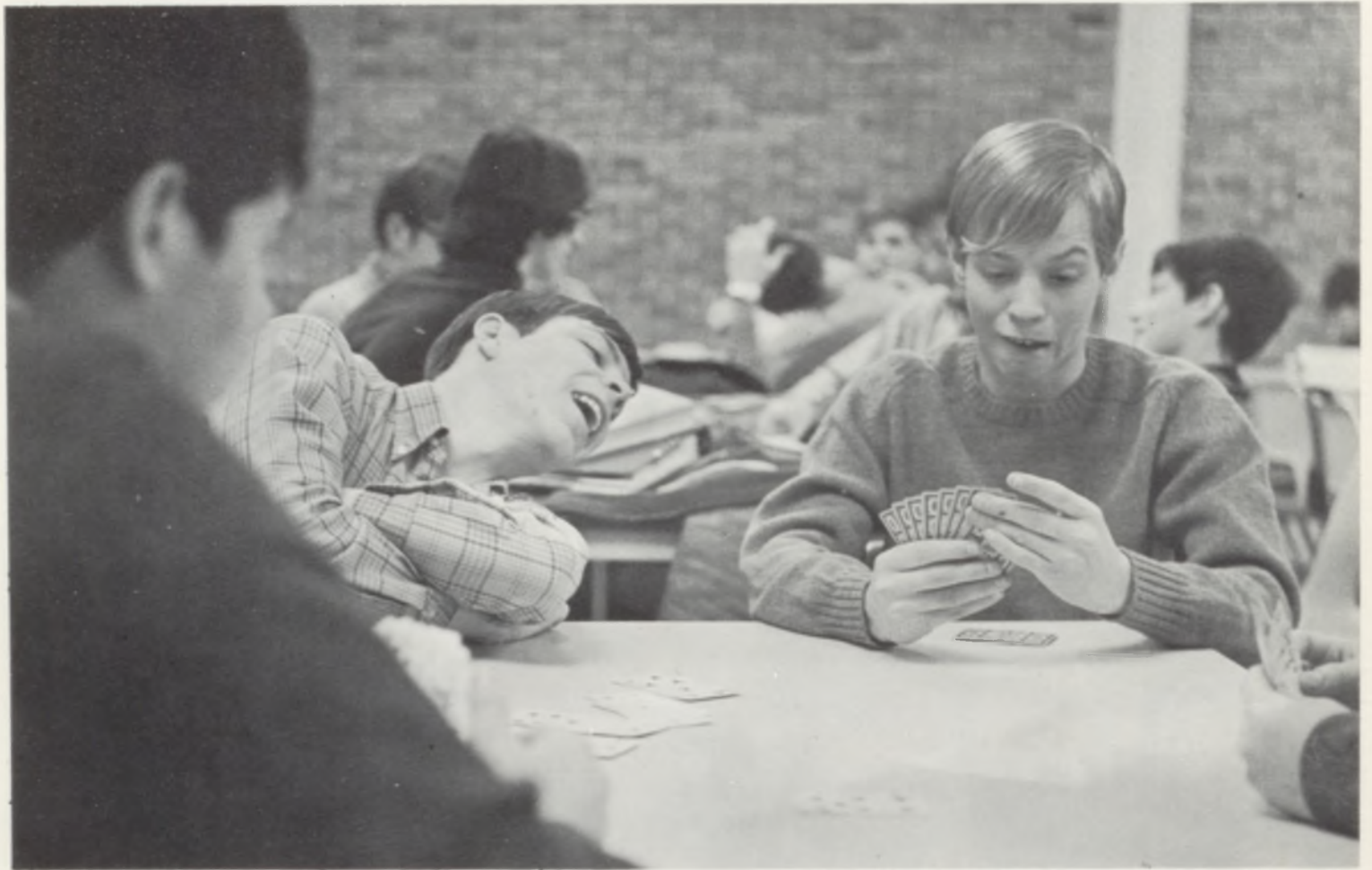
representing these different careers addressed the club members once every month to inform them of special career opportunities.

Chess Enthusiasts Enter League for First Time

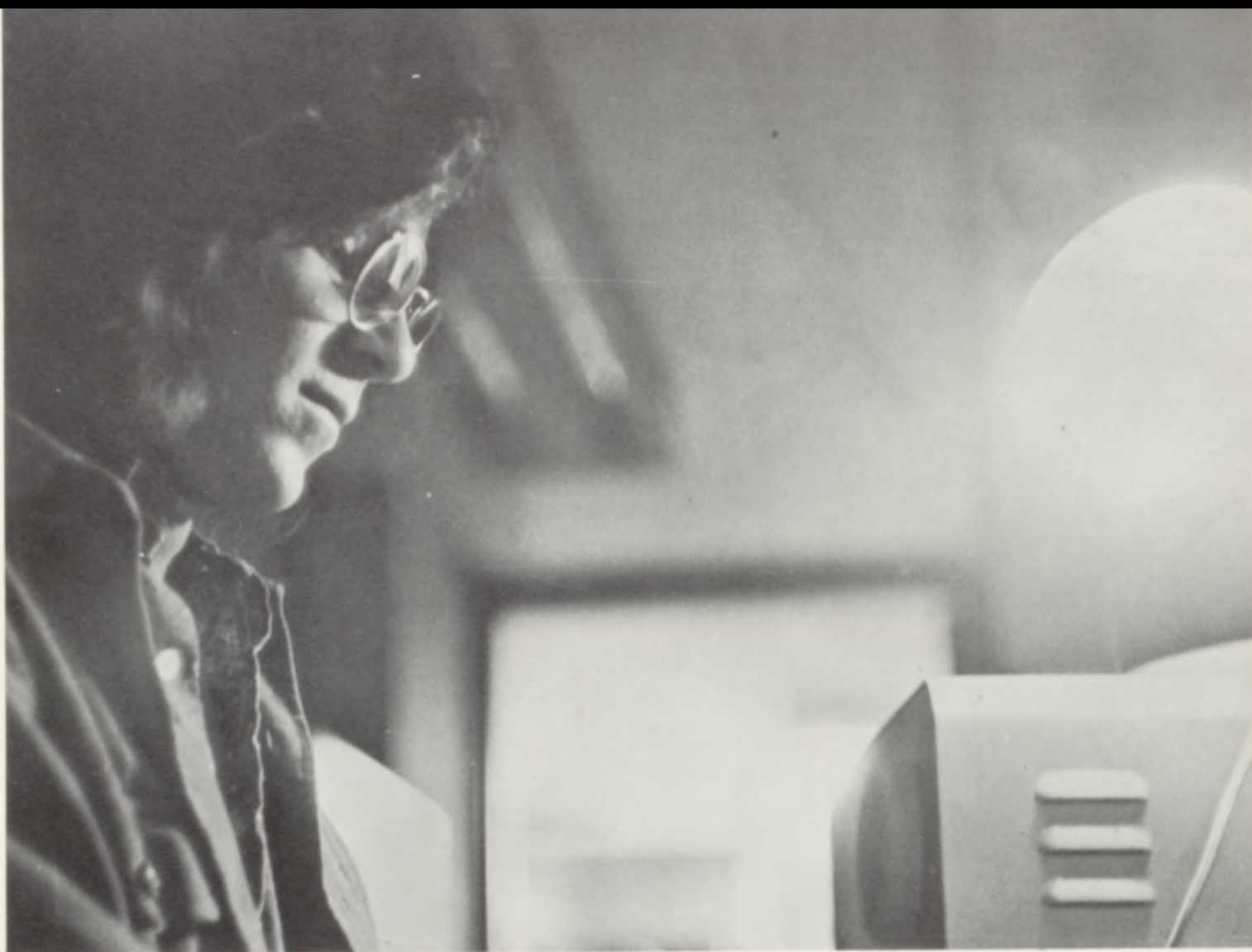

The Bridge Club organized a Student-Faculty tournament this year. Members of the club played duplicate bridge each morning and concentrated on improving their skills.

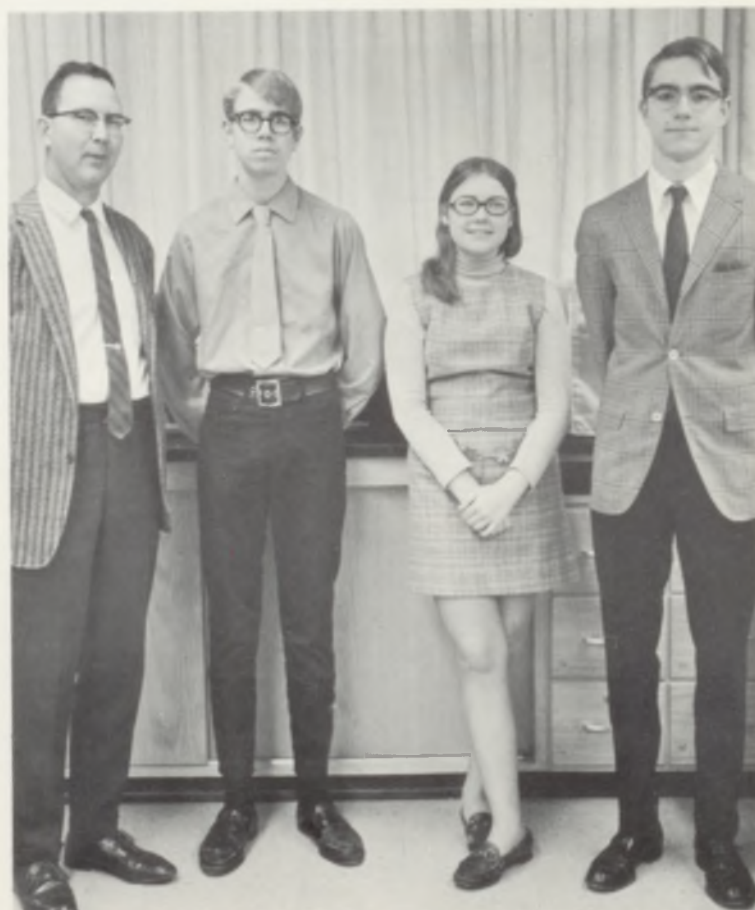


Experimenting with a photo electric theremin, Harmon Shay both entertains and instructs members of the Science Club.

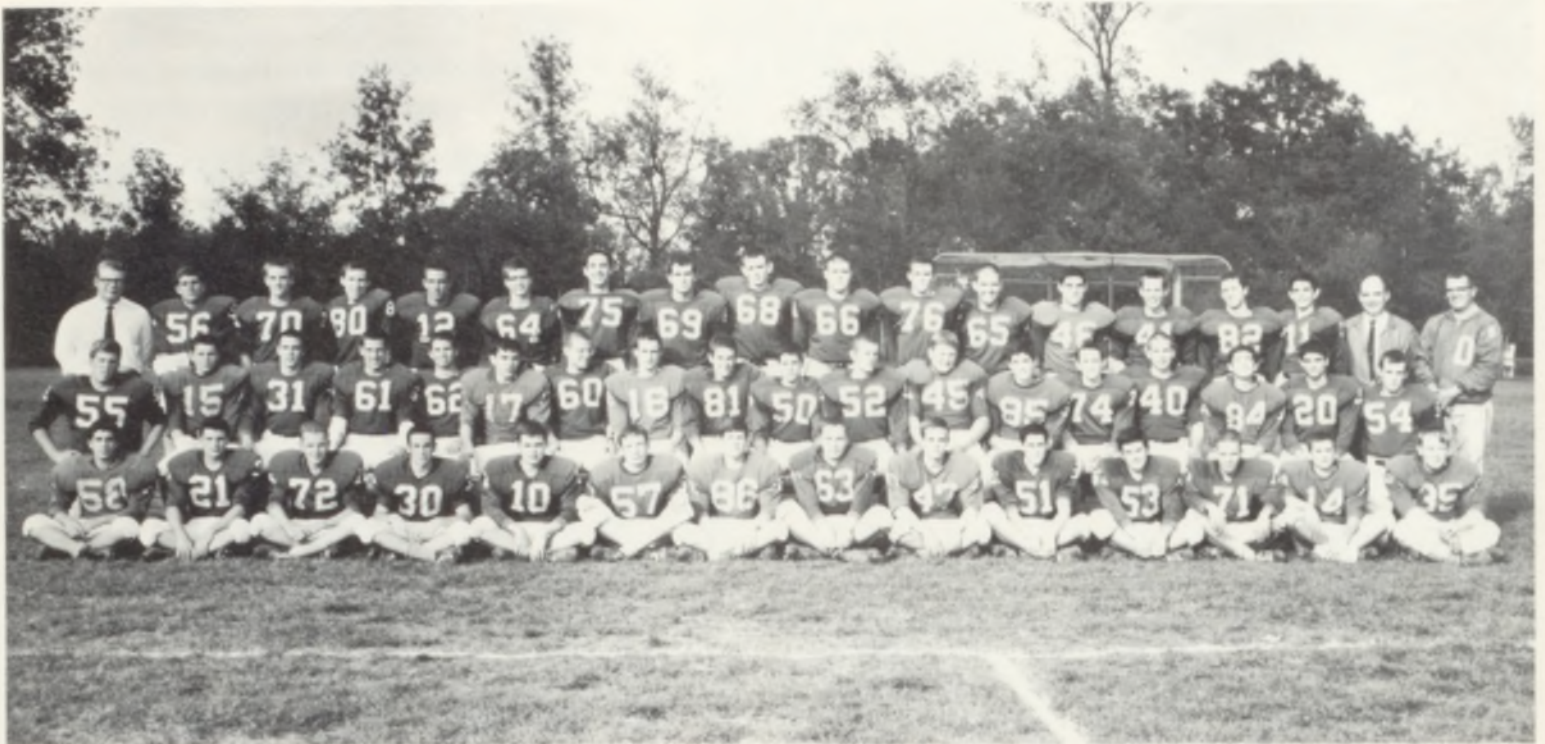

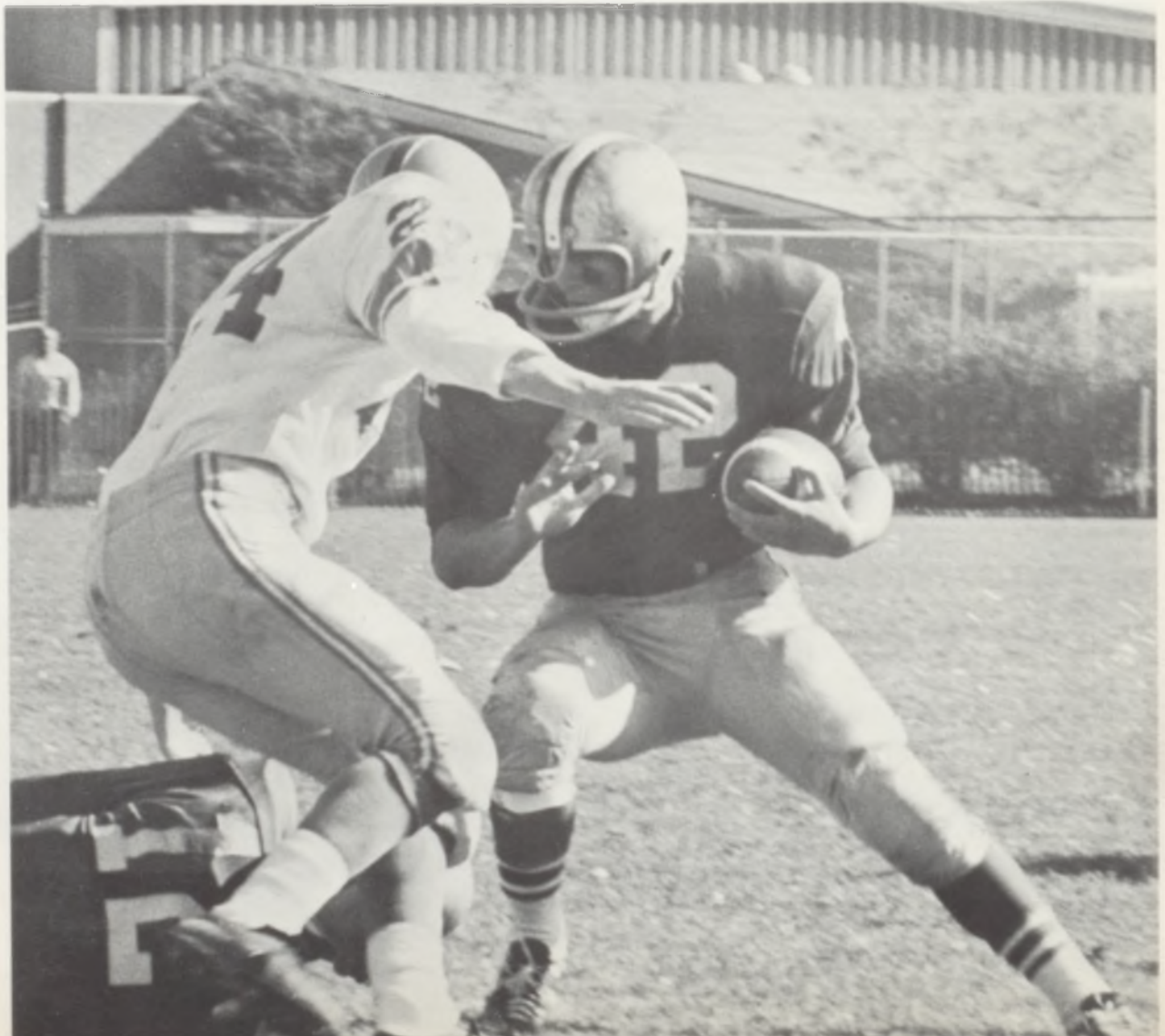

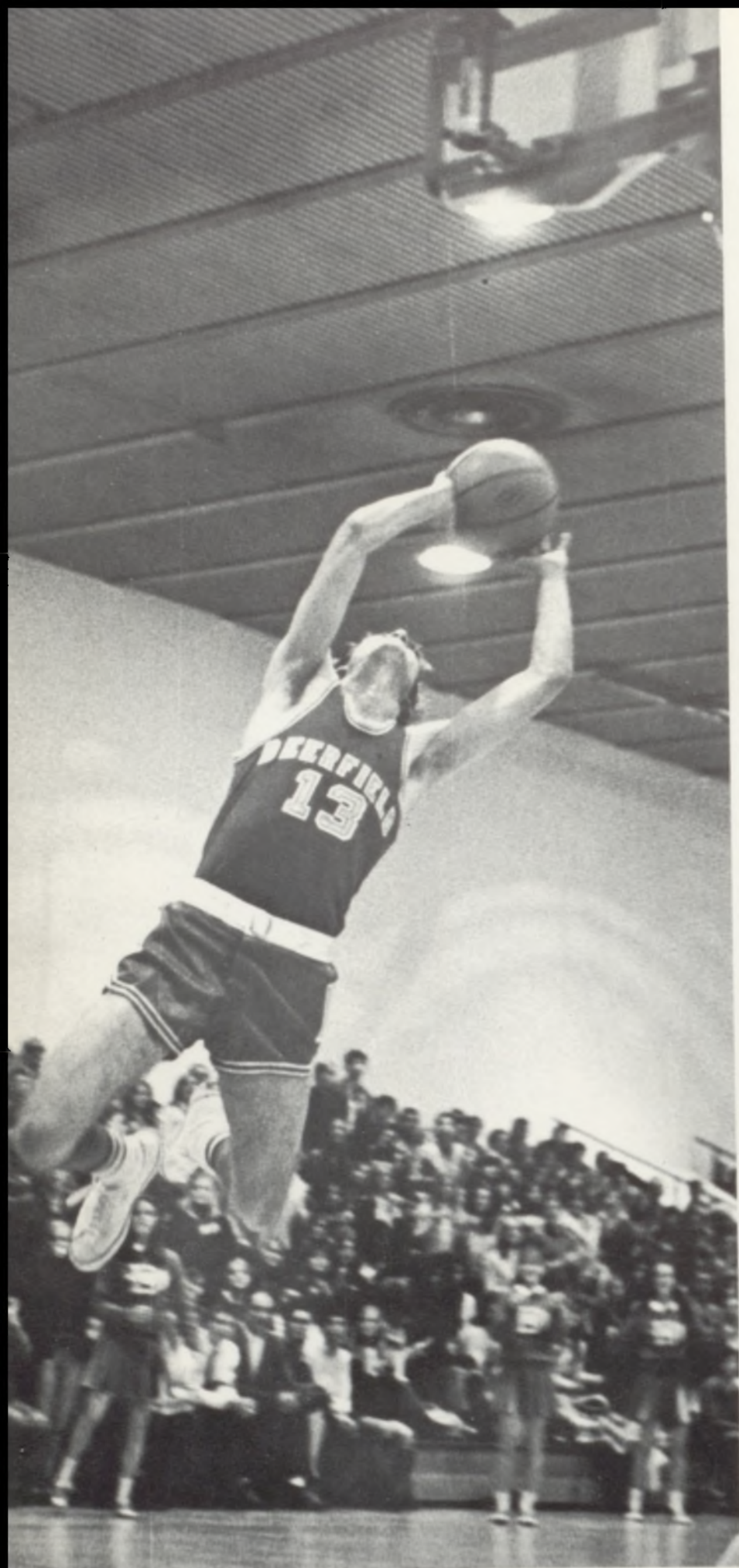


During the crucial Maine South game, Kirk Gustie drives around his opponent toward the basket.

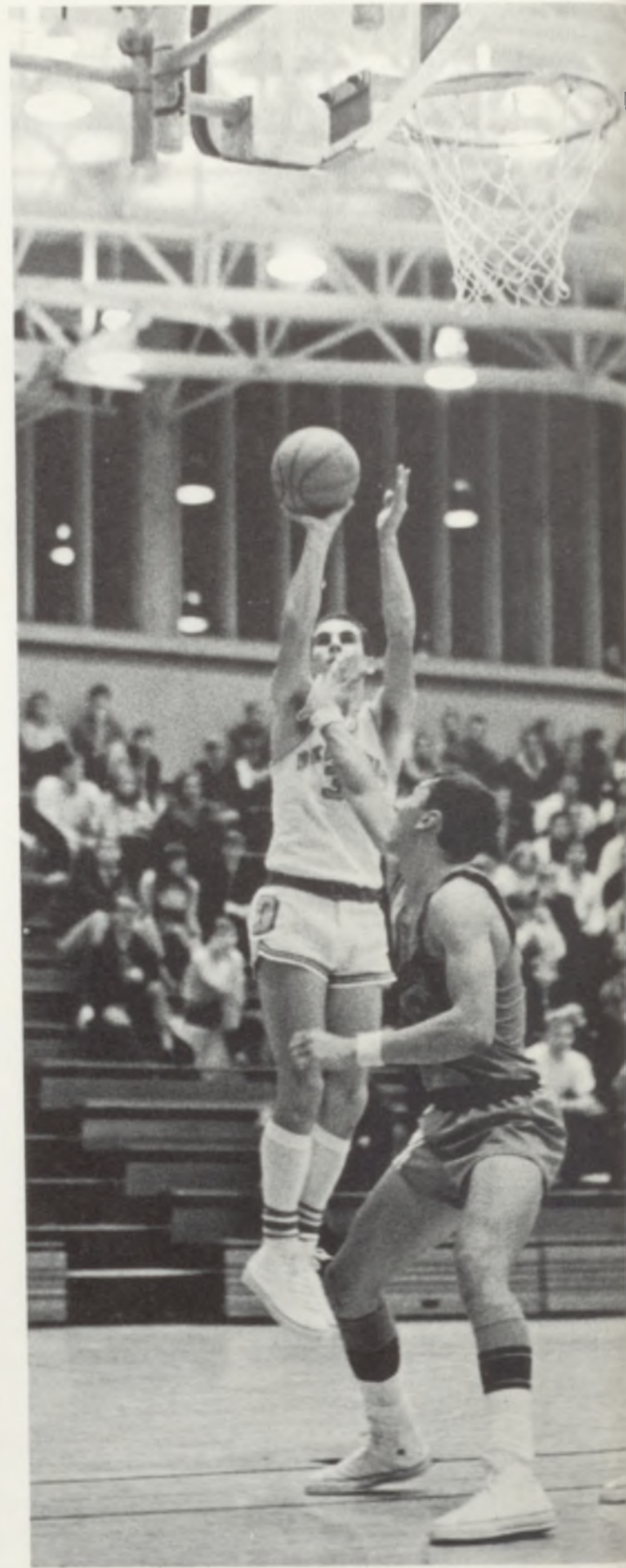

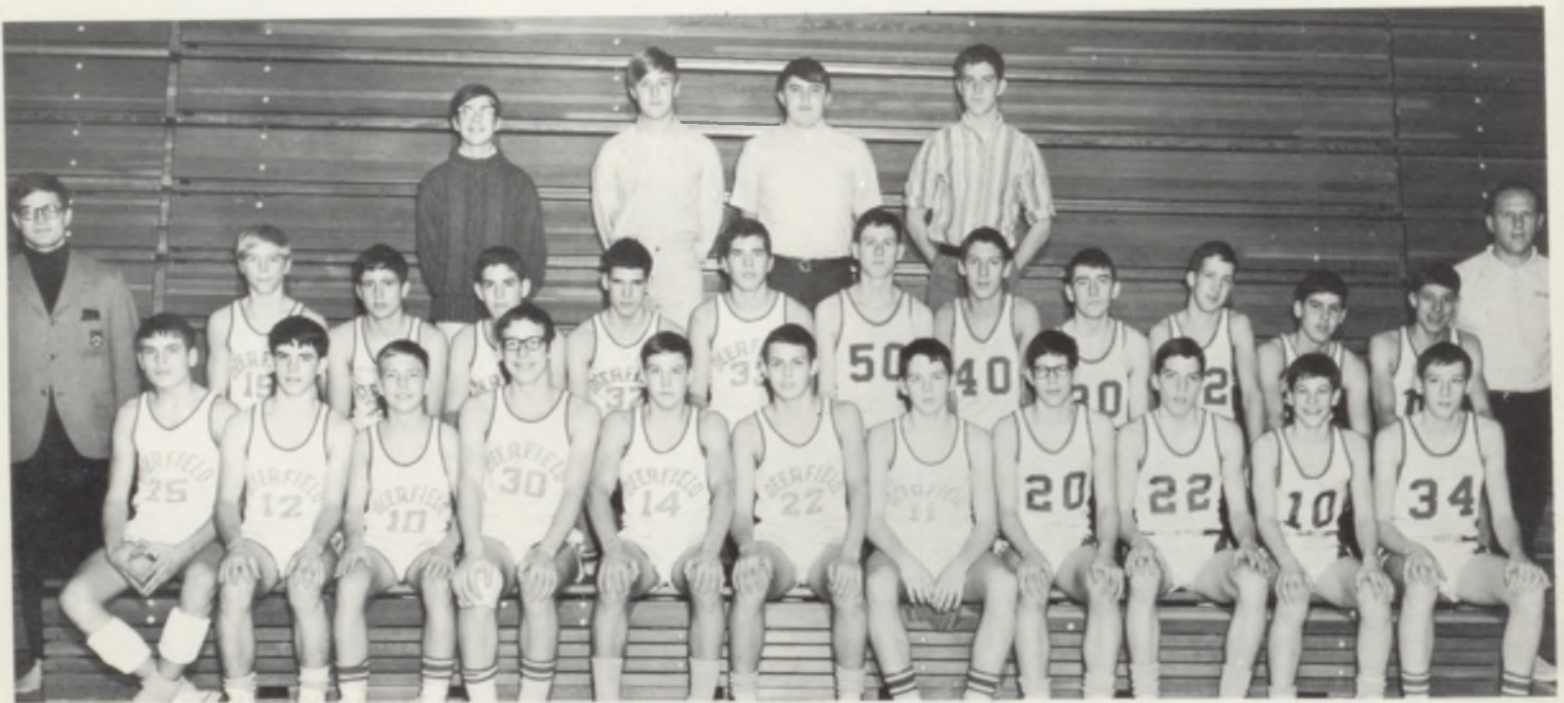
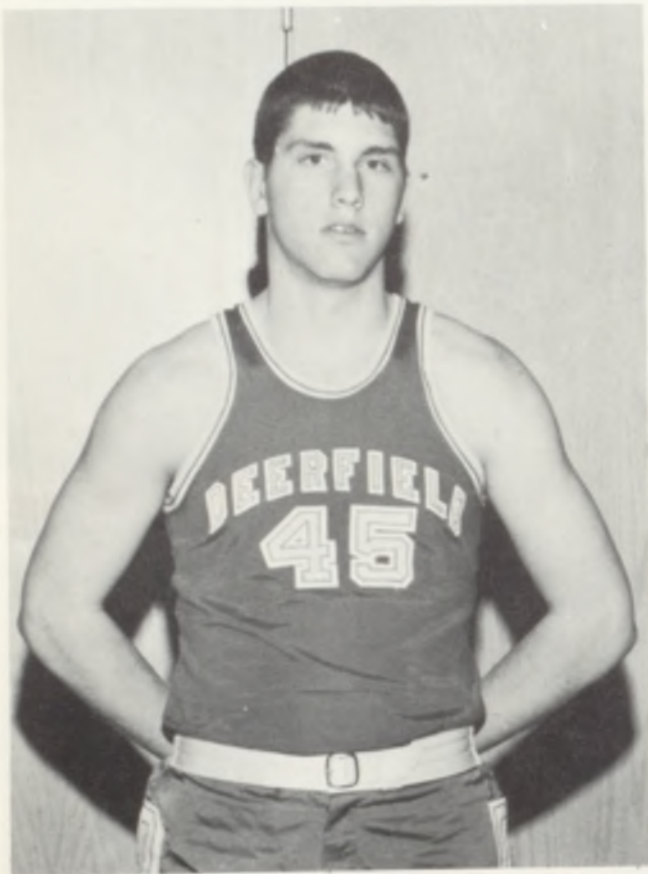

Sophomore Sean Savage pulls in a rebound as teammates Jim Lindquist and Mark Nelson look on.

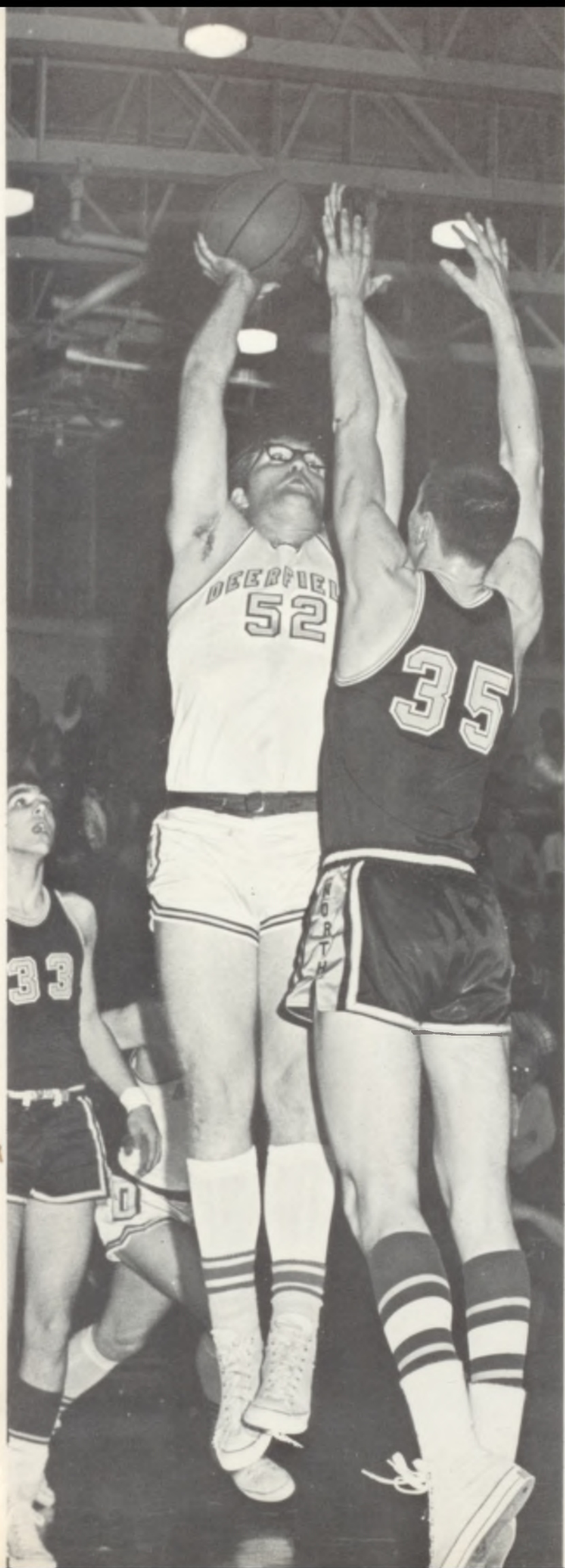

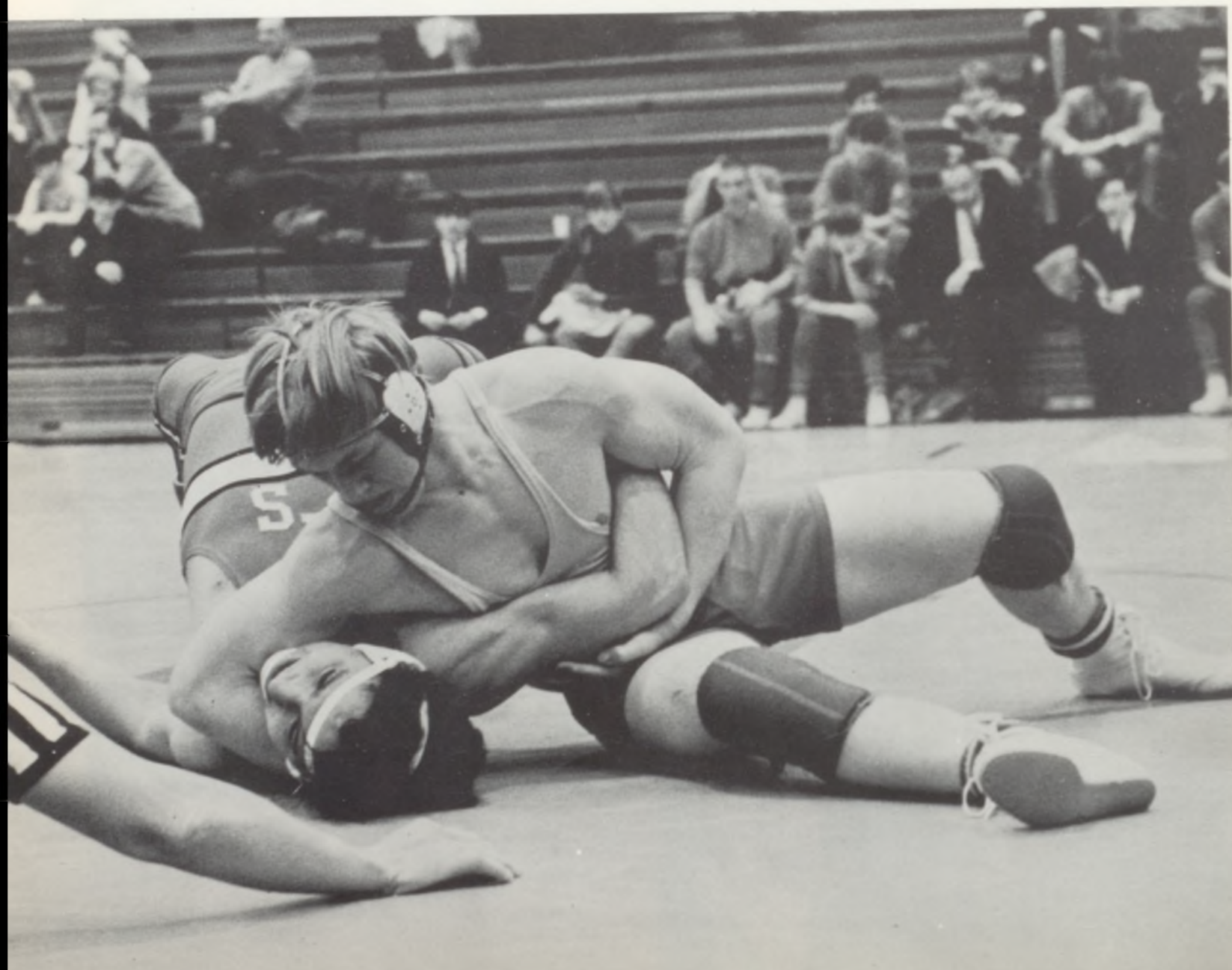

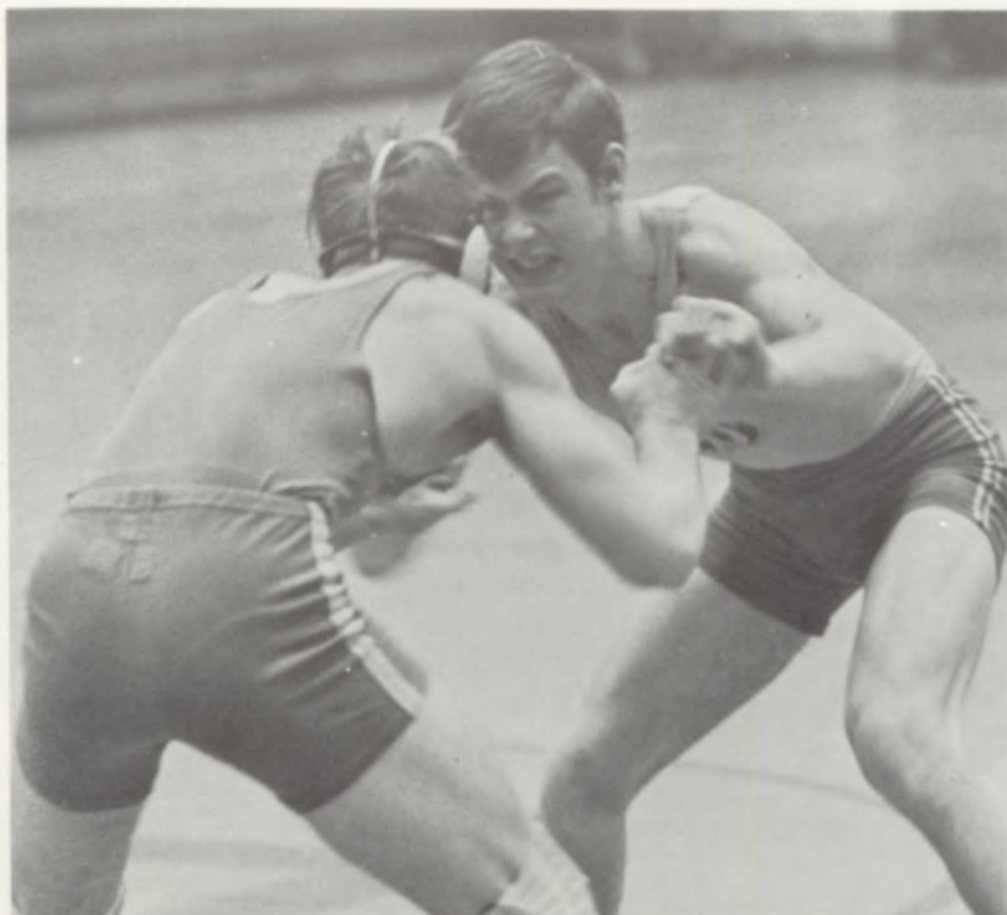

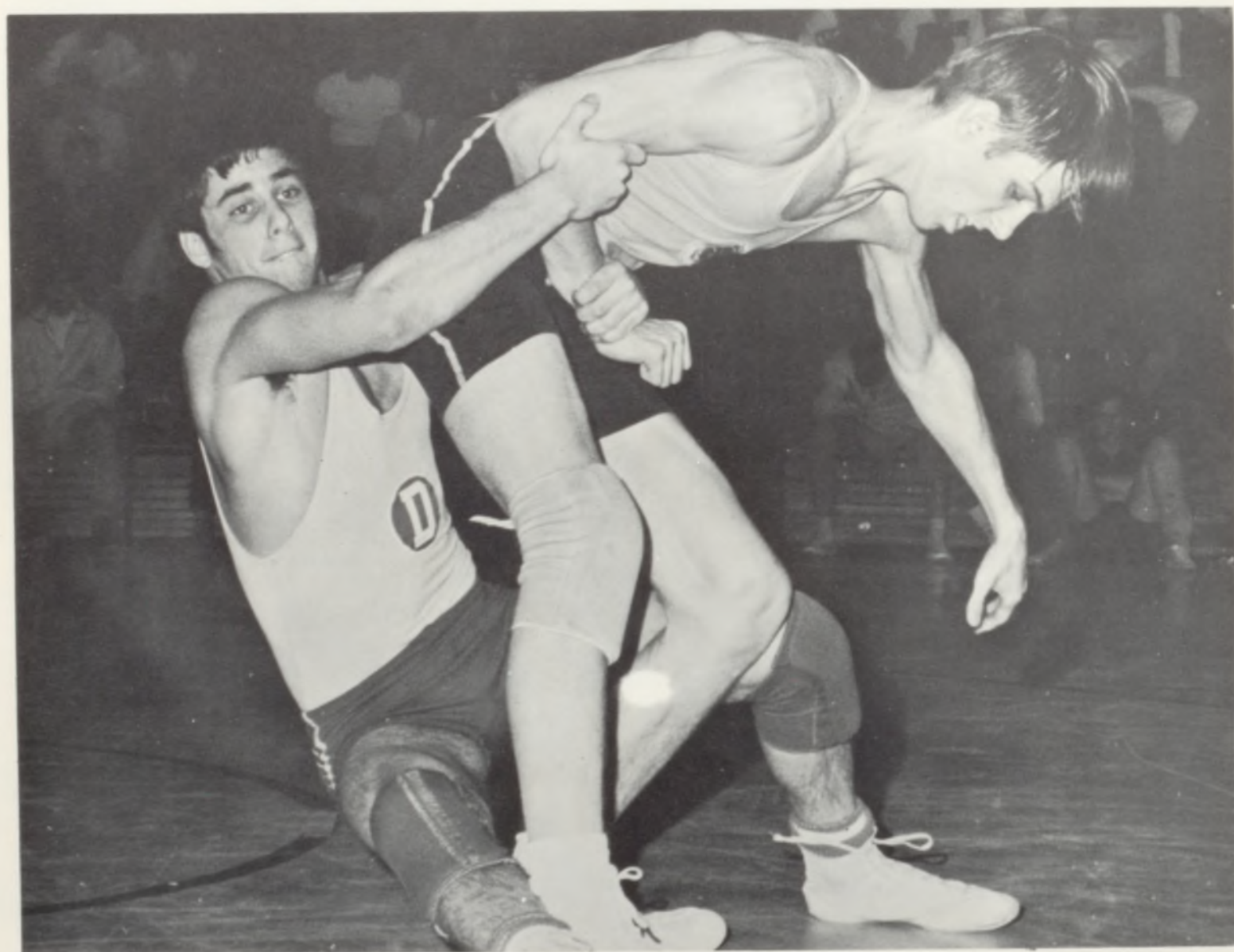

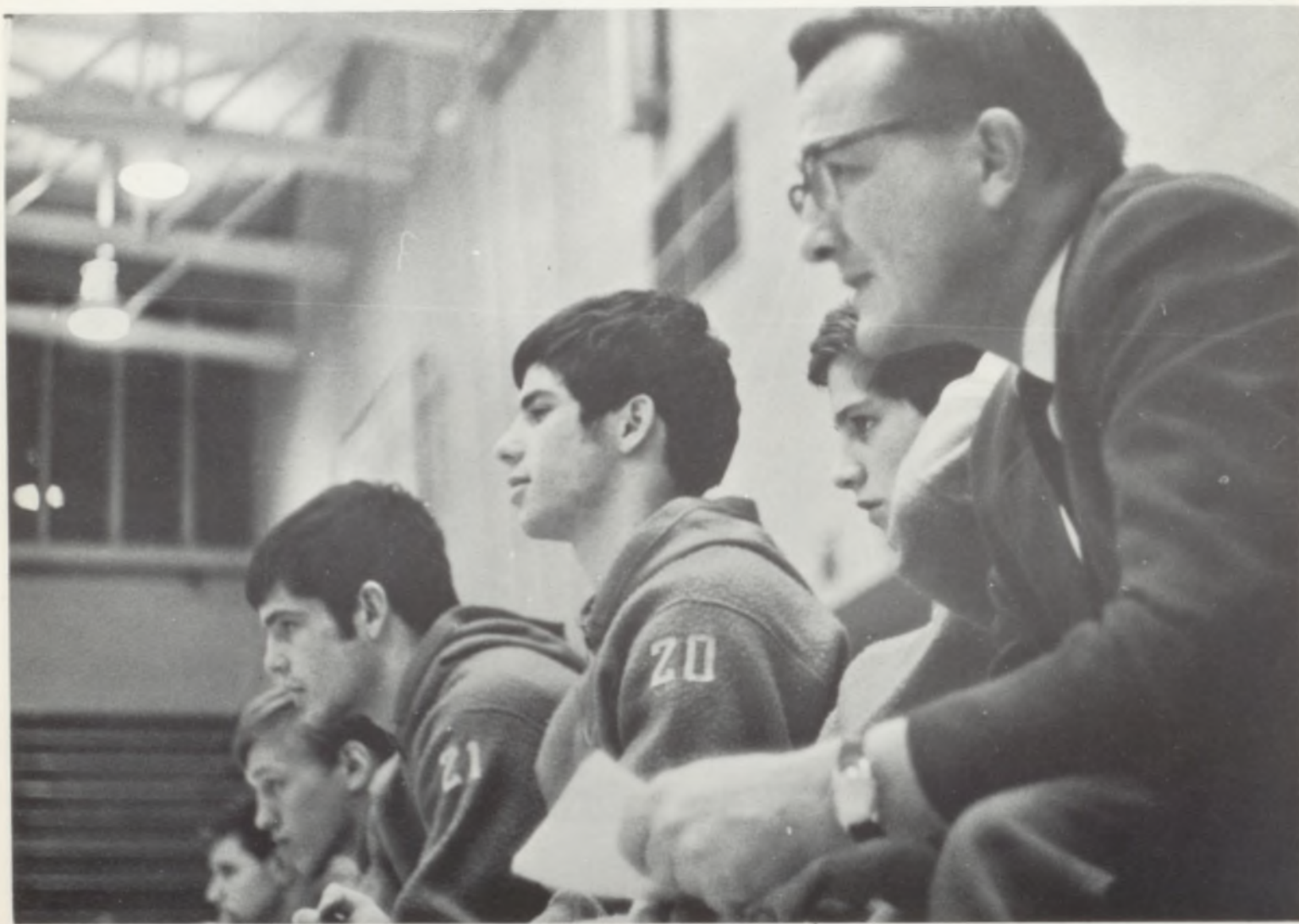

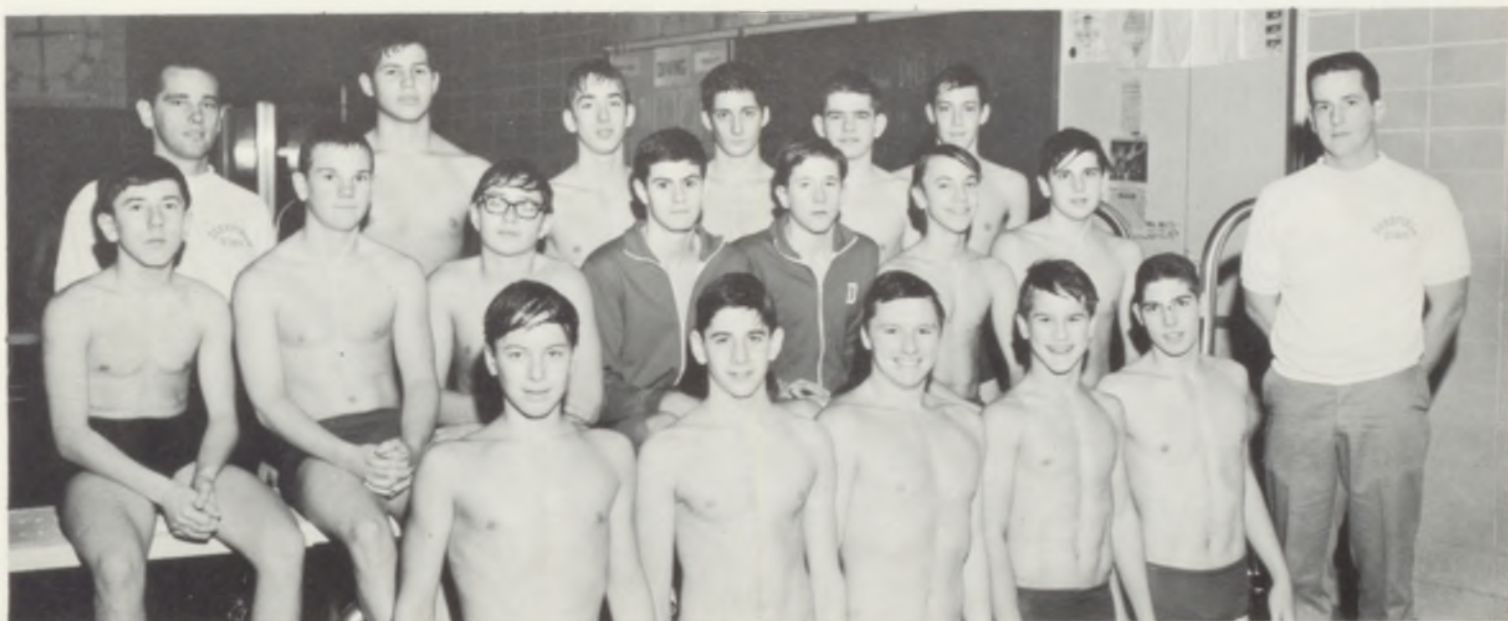

The sophomore mermen had similar success, as they also finished first in the Central Suburban League. The DHS freshmen placed 2nd in conference and 6th in state.

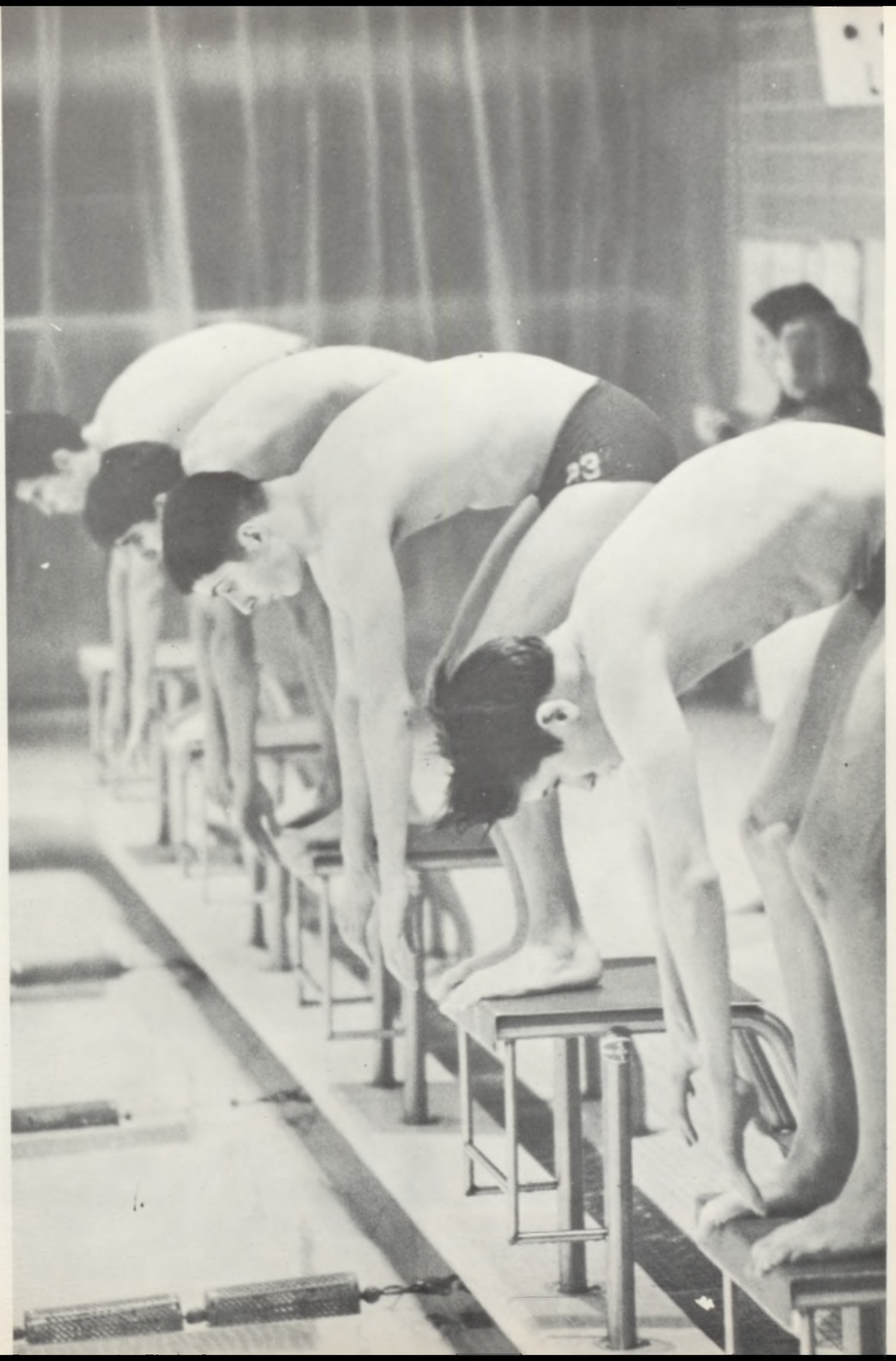

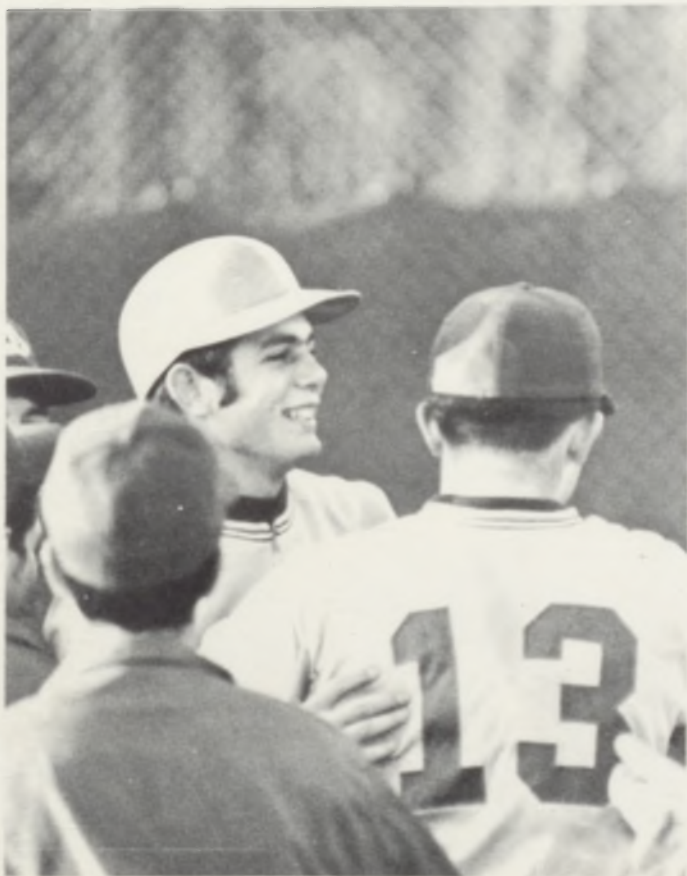

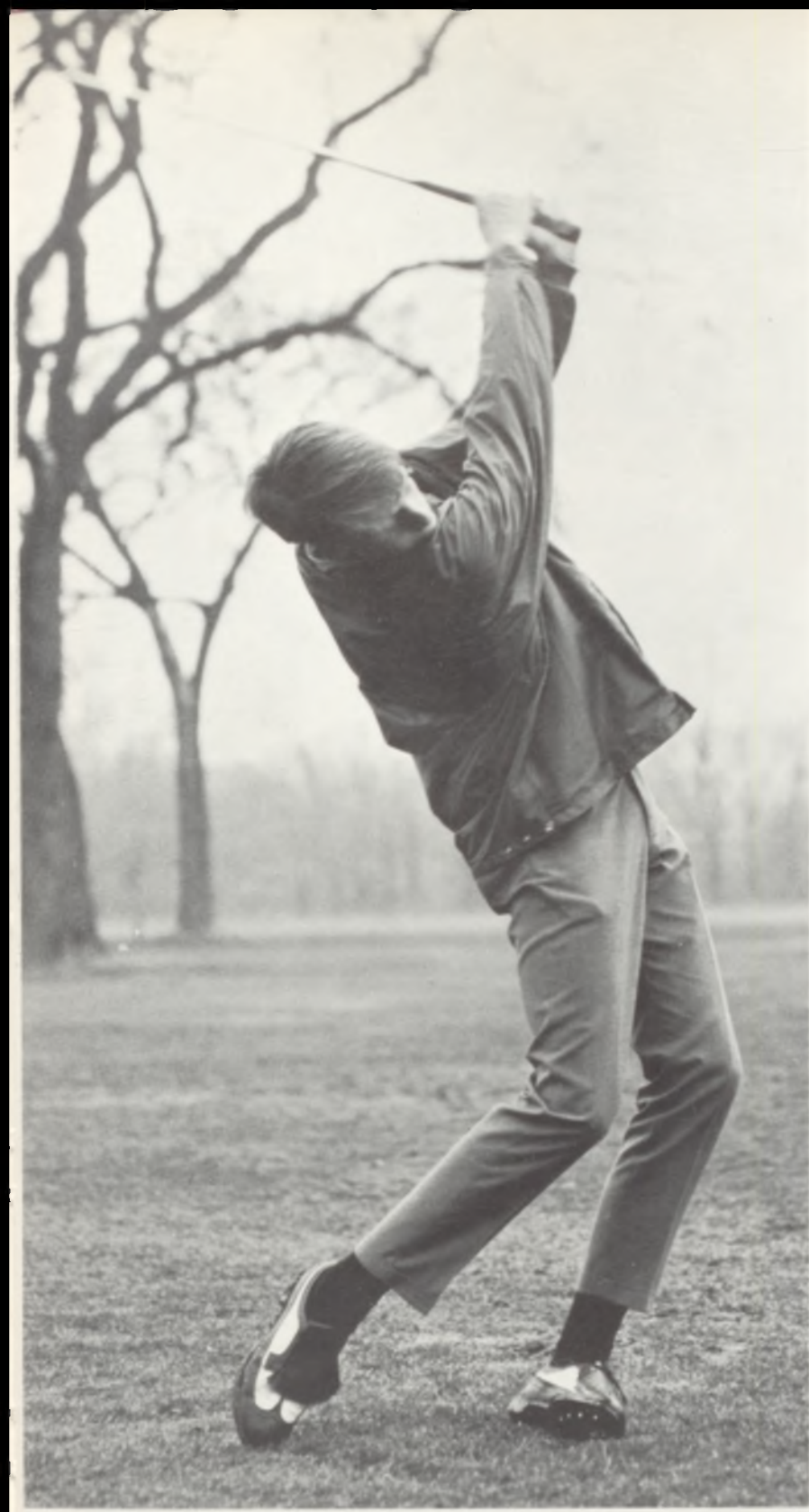

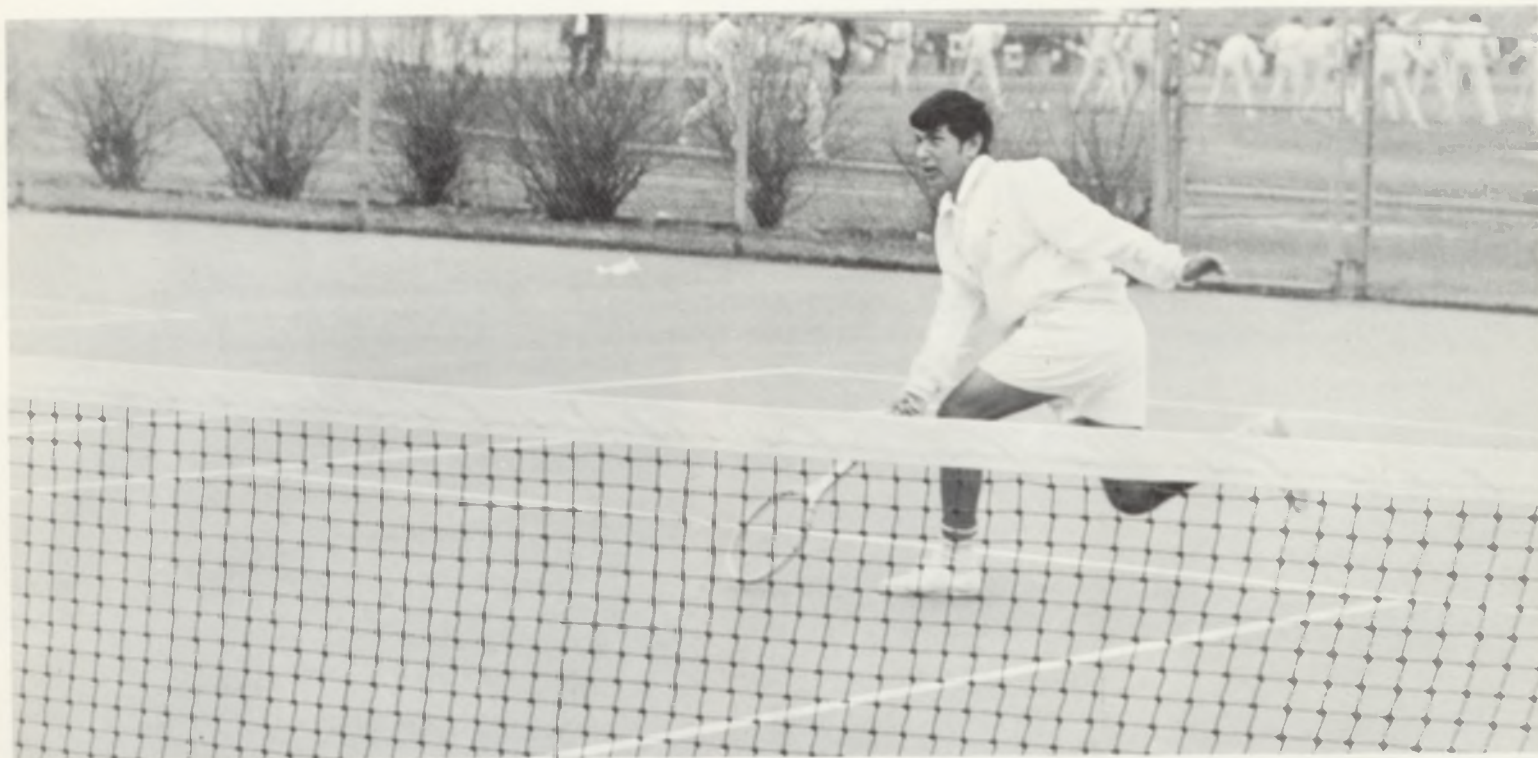
DHS Netmen End Erratic Season in Fourth Place

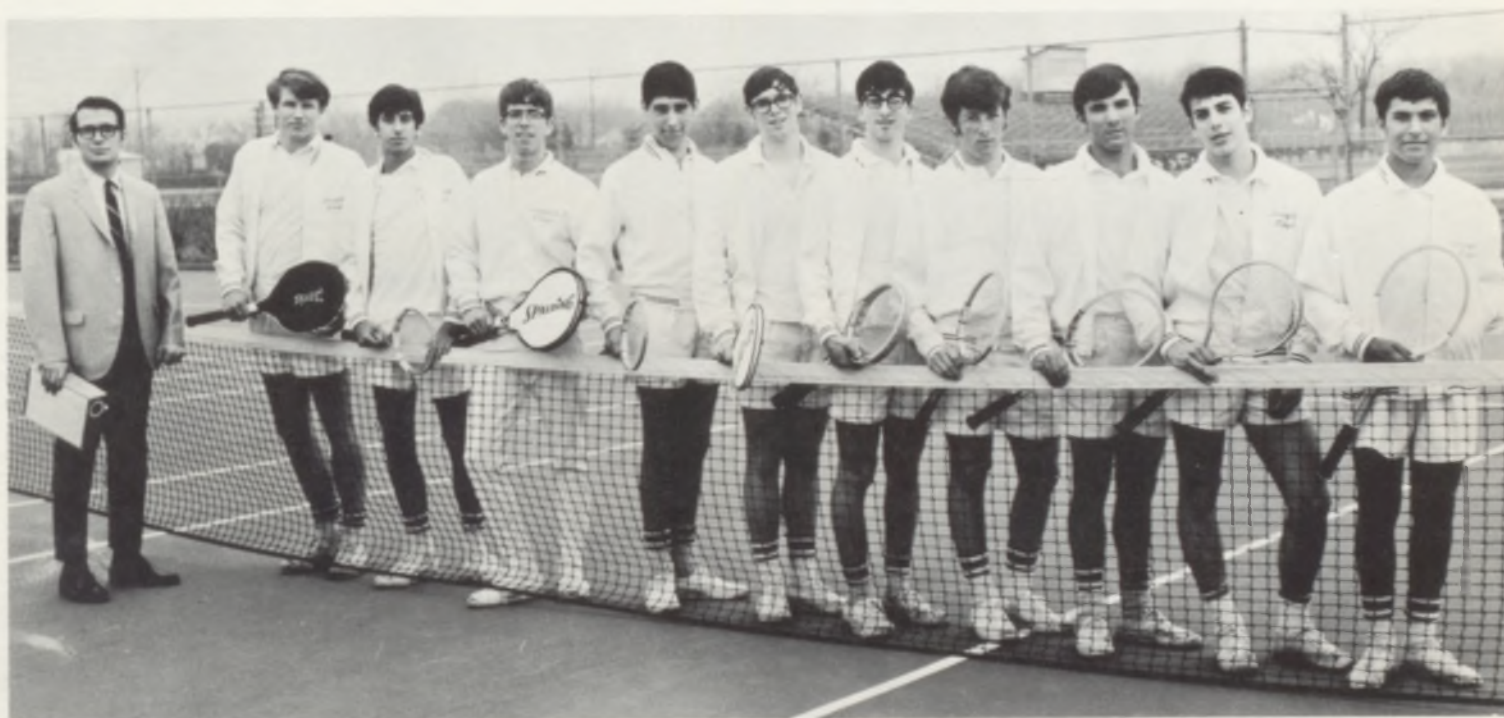

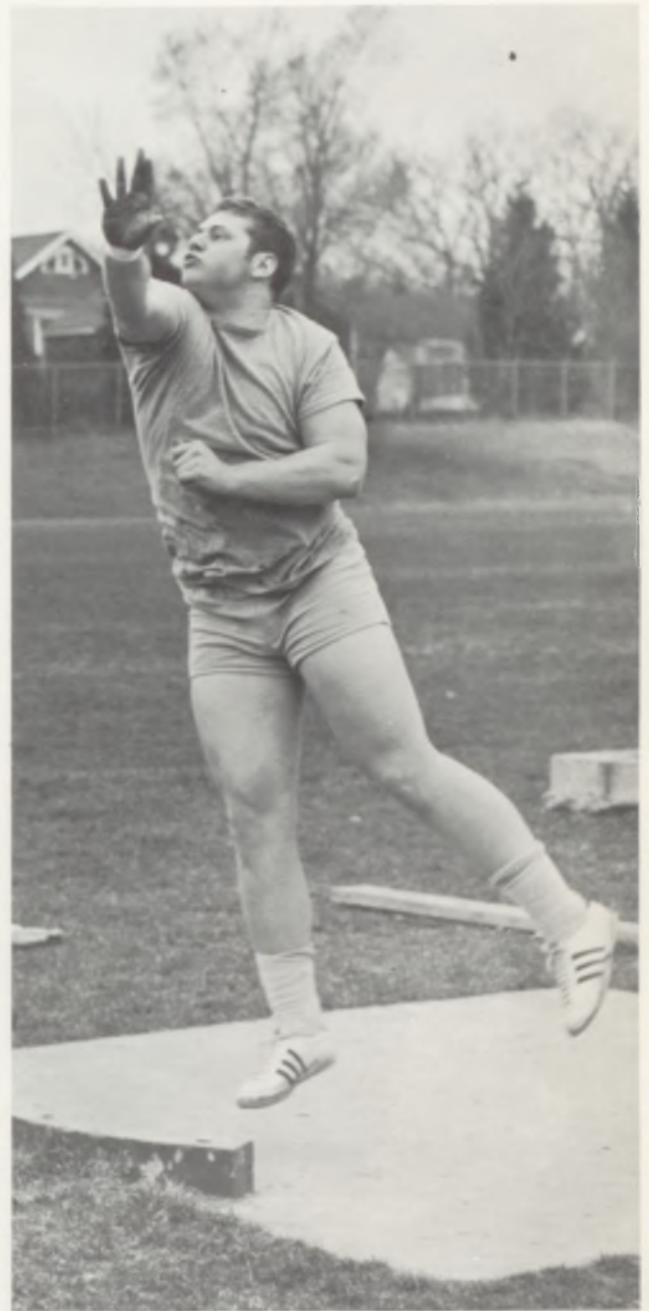
Despite miserable weather conditions which included a tornado, Warrior runners and fieldmen outdid themselves all year, as six new team re-
