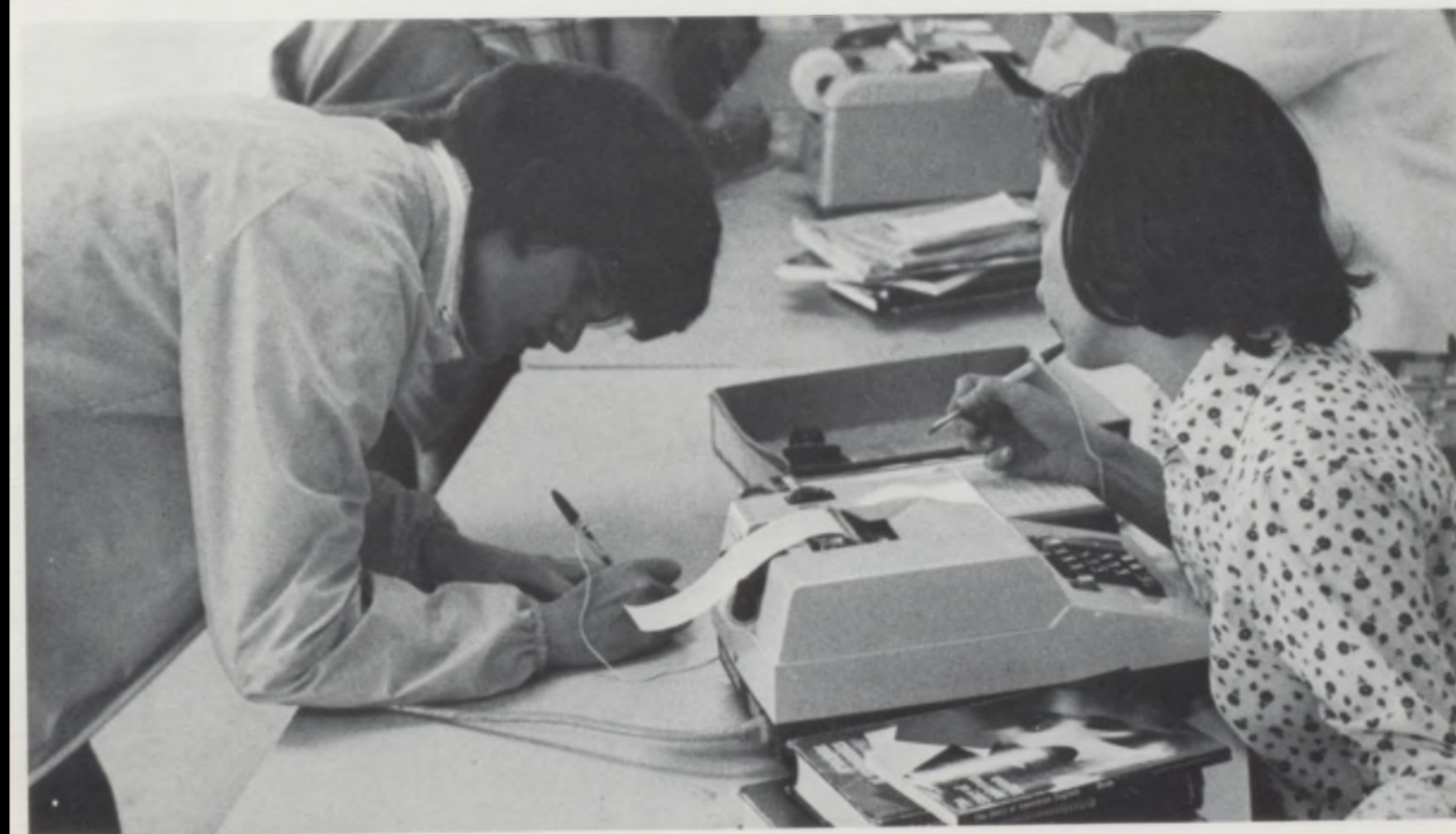




## Back To Books

out a busy day.

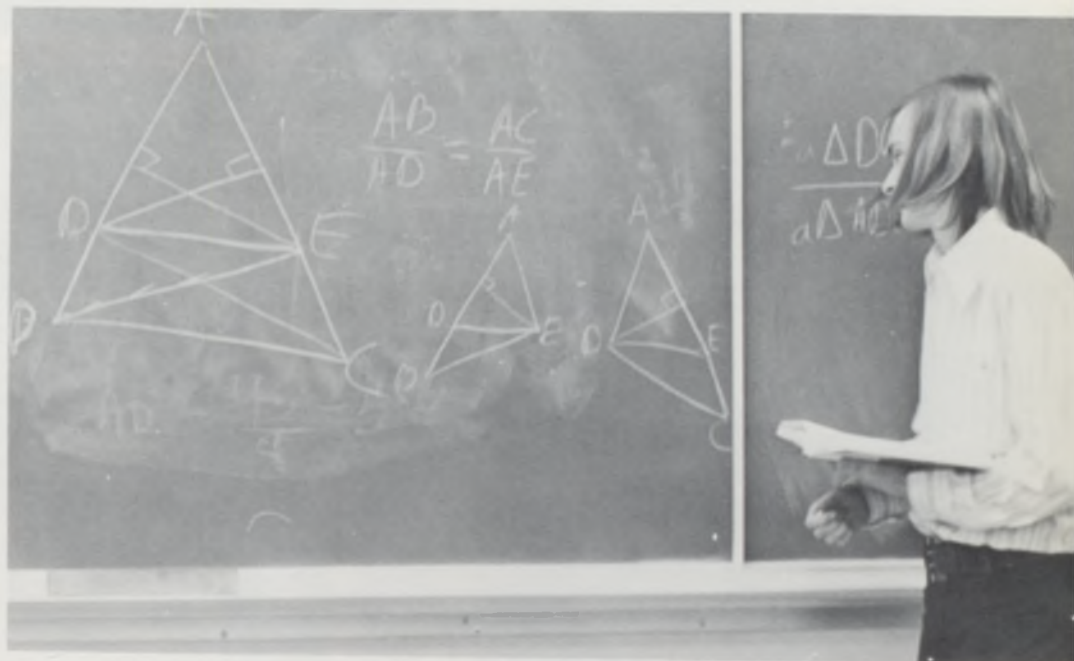
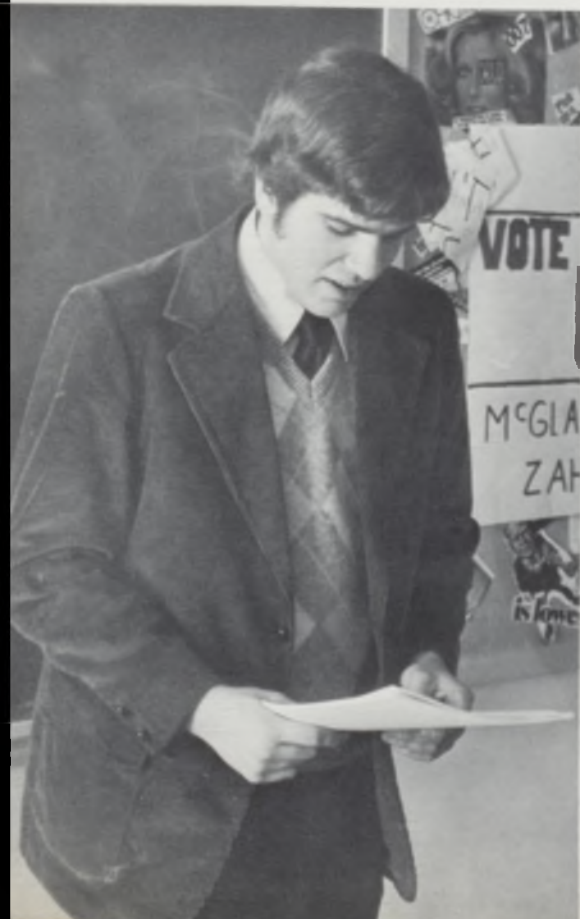

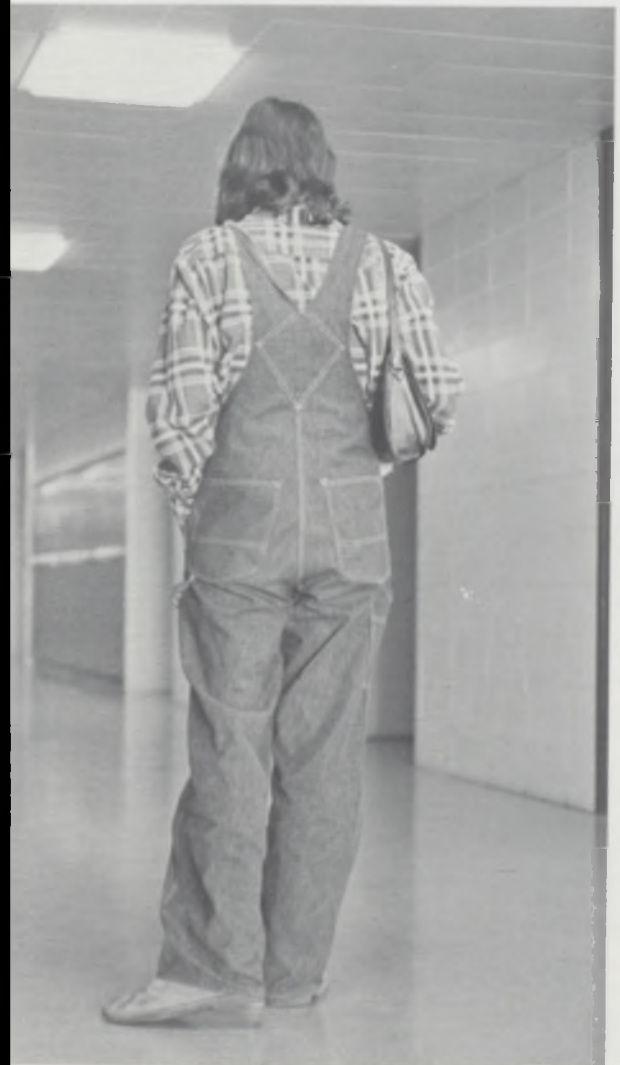


## Fads & Fashions

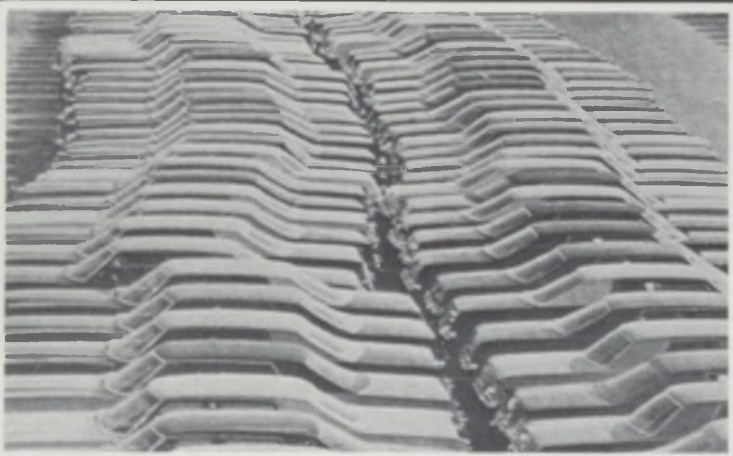

and  $a^2 + b^2 = c^2$ .

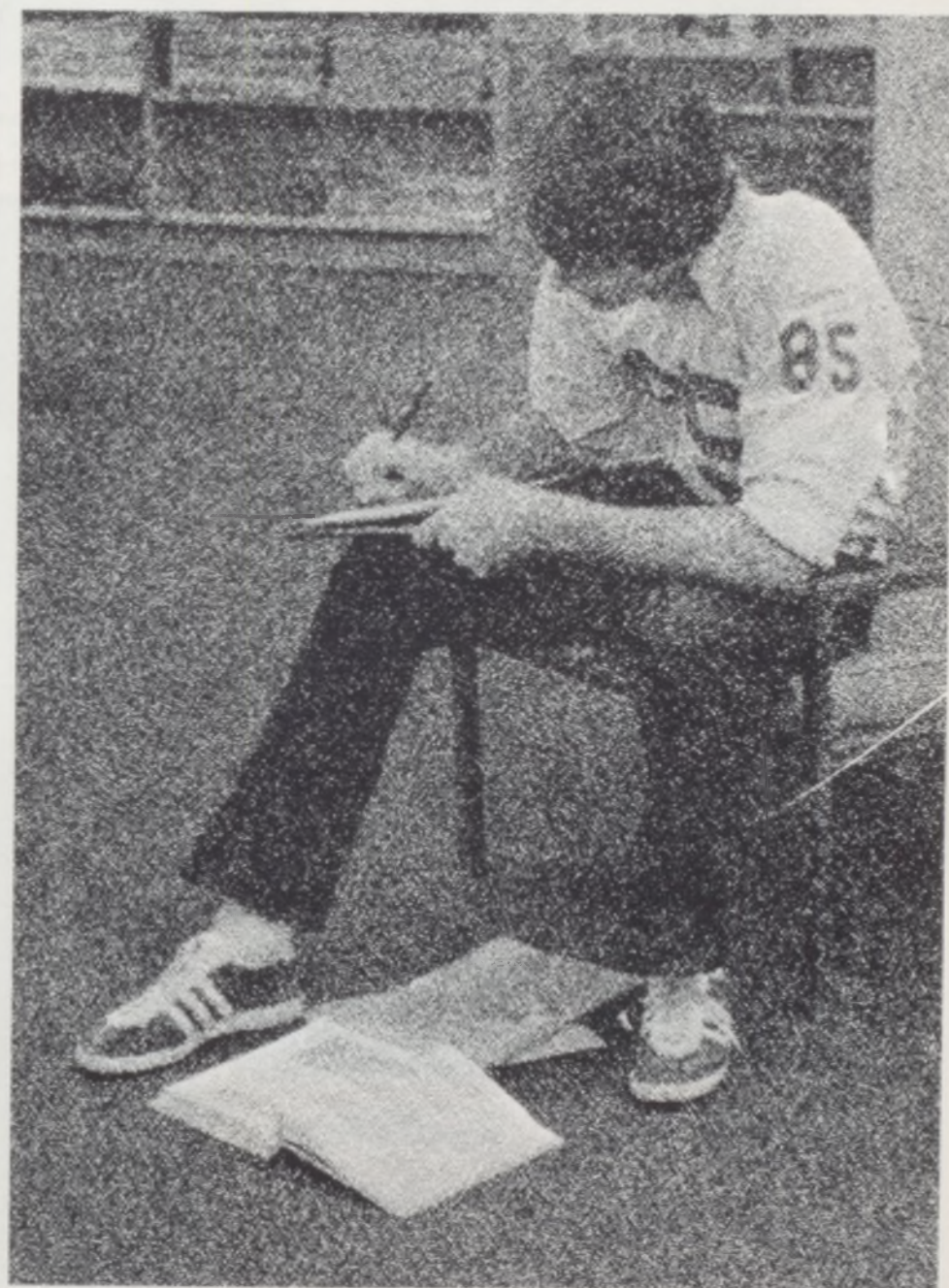
Some mastered skills, such as

# CHEATING

With a formula written on his wrist, an important fact inscribed on his folder, his eyes toned, and a headful of memorized answers, a Deerfield High student walked into one of his classes totally prepared to cheat. He may only use some of his devices, but he is sure that he won't be caught. And he probably won't be caught, since cheating is fairly easy at DHS. How much this student cheats, in what classes, by what methods, and why he cheats is known only to him. Out of sheer curiosity, O\*YAD distributed a short survey to a representative cross-section of DHS students to discover some of these cheating tactics. After reading, tallying, and sorting through about 300 surveys we got a few answers.

Methods of cheating ranged from the common look-at-a-smart-person's-paper to the not-so-common taking the answer sheet. The majority of the students surveyed cheated only during tests and simply looked at a neighbor's paper. The second most common method was the use of crib notes. Freshmen also wrote on books and folders. Sophomores frequently asked a neighbor for the answer out loud. Juniors used their books; and seniors used "cheat sheets" and collaborated on take-home tests. There were other

methods that were not as widespread as the above but perhaps more effective. Some students borrowed tests from students who had already taken them and used them as study guides. One person claimed to have bribed a teacher.

Why do people cheat? Surveys understandably varied the most in this part. Answers to this question ranged from the often-responded "I didn't know the answer" to the unusual "so I won't be a social out-cast." Other reasons were "to get a good grade," and "I didn't have time to study." There were also many thoughtful students who cheated because "good grades are important to parents." A lot of kids cheated because they disliked their teachers. Some cheated simply because their teacher was so "dumb" that cheating was fun and easy to get away with.

One student admitted that she had cheated at times, but under "comments" she wrote: "Cheating doesn't usually help anyway. It's an easy way out, but in the long run it doesn't have any value." Some people haven't realized this yet; many of those that have still continue to cheat to some extent. The art of cheating on tests will most likely be practiced as long as there are students.

## BOREDOM

George had slept through homeroom, gone to biology first period and had really enjoyed the double-period lab. Third period he played cards in the cafeteria, fourth period his eyes closed as he listened to his speech teacher lecture on outlines. His geometry class did little to wake him up and it wasn't until lunch that he once again felt alive. But he still had to go to French (although there was a substitute so that class shouldn't be boring), gym, and health, which was the worst of all.

George was an average student; like him, most students found that each day was composed of a mixture of excitement and boredom, depending on what each class was doing. The classes students found the most boring were those which they were required to take: first-year algebra, English, and U.S. History. For sophomores, health was boring and freshmen still had to cope with study halls. Sometimes electives proved boring also, depending on the student's attitude. Seniors especially, fell victim to "senior slump" and went to their classes in a daze, although they had more options (senior option, work-study programs) to alleviate the boredom than most students. Many students wrote on surveys that they were bored in all of their classes, or more accurately, that boredom varied

from day to day.

Why are students bored? Many felt that it was the teacher's fault, and his or her method of presentation. But just as many others felt it was due to the subject material. Some wrote that boredom was caused by a combination of both, in addition to their own attitude. Upperclassmen especially realized that their attitude played a part in boredom, and wrote that boredom could be stopped if they made an extra effort to listen and pay attention. As soon as they drifted away, though, boredom once again set in. Other causes of boredom were classmates, the easiness of the class, and some students blamed the school system in general.

One person commented that he would tell his teacher of his boredom if he knew the teacher wouldn't be offended. More than likely the teacher already realized the problem but couldn't solve it himself. It takes co-operation between both teacher and student to stop boredom. Whatever the cause, some boredom does exist for the majority of students. It's no wonder that when mothers ask students what was new in school that day, many only mumble a muffled reply.

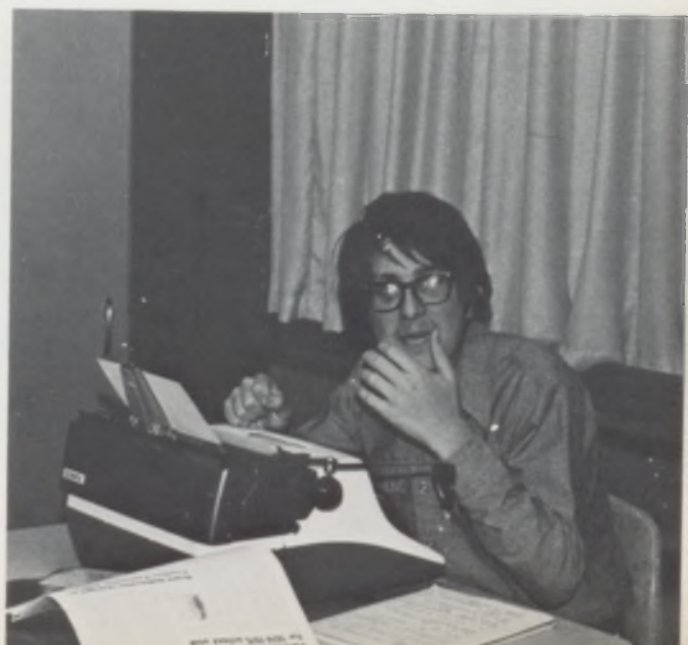

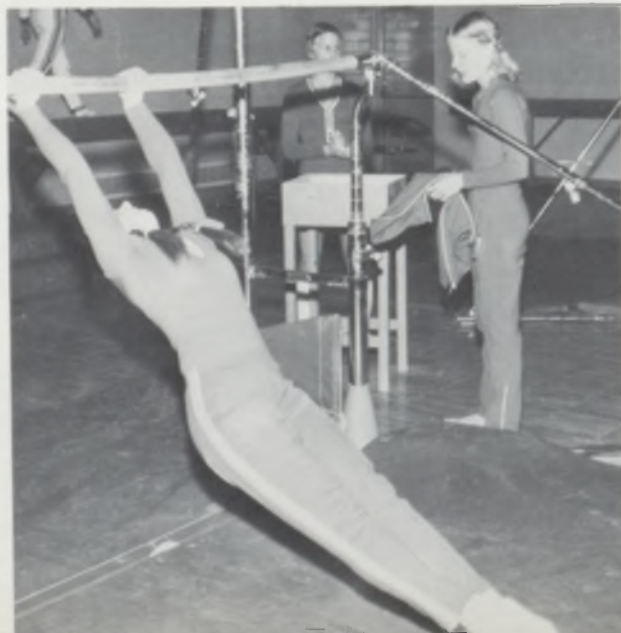

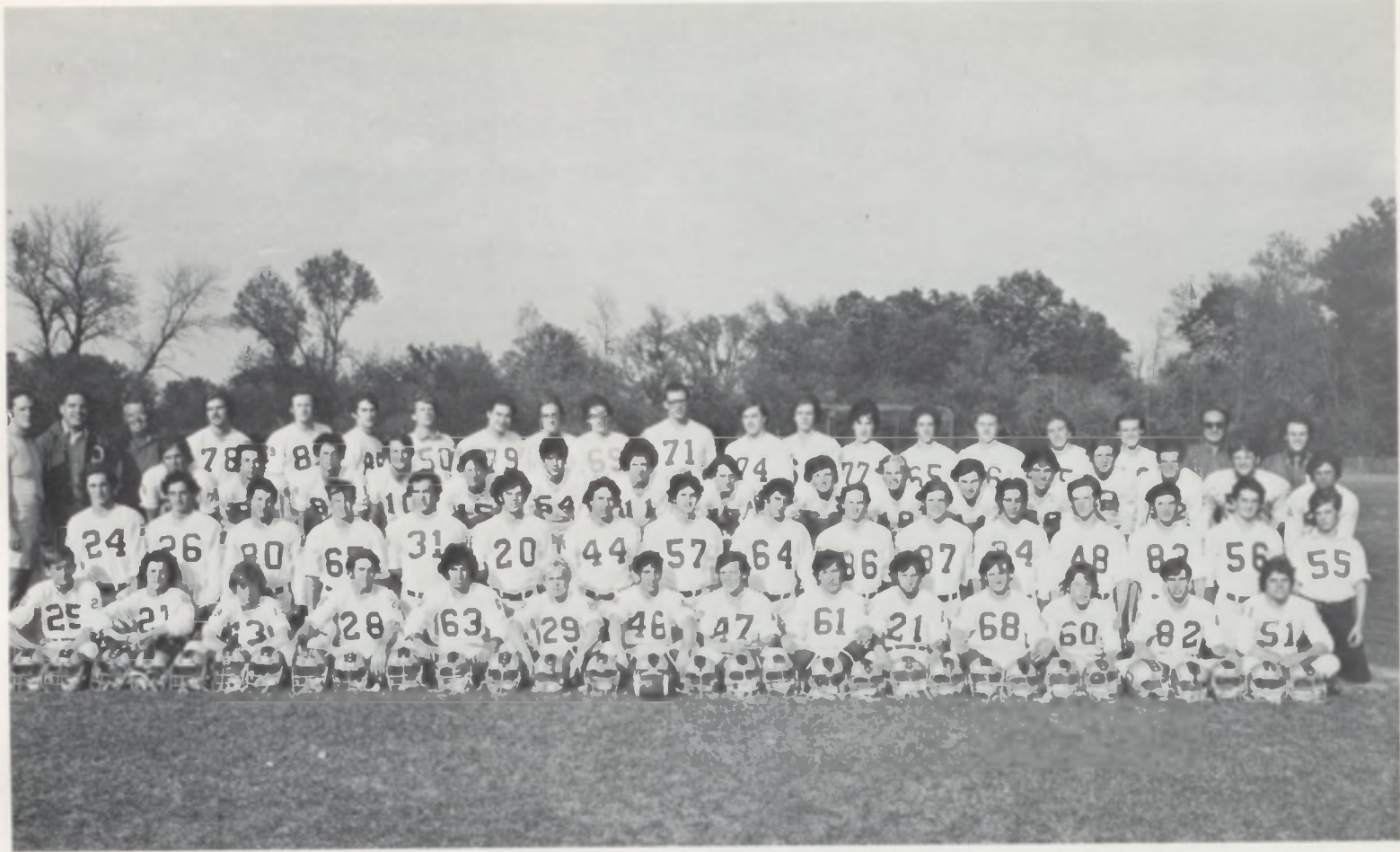

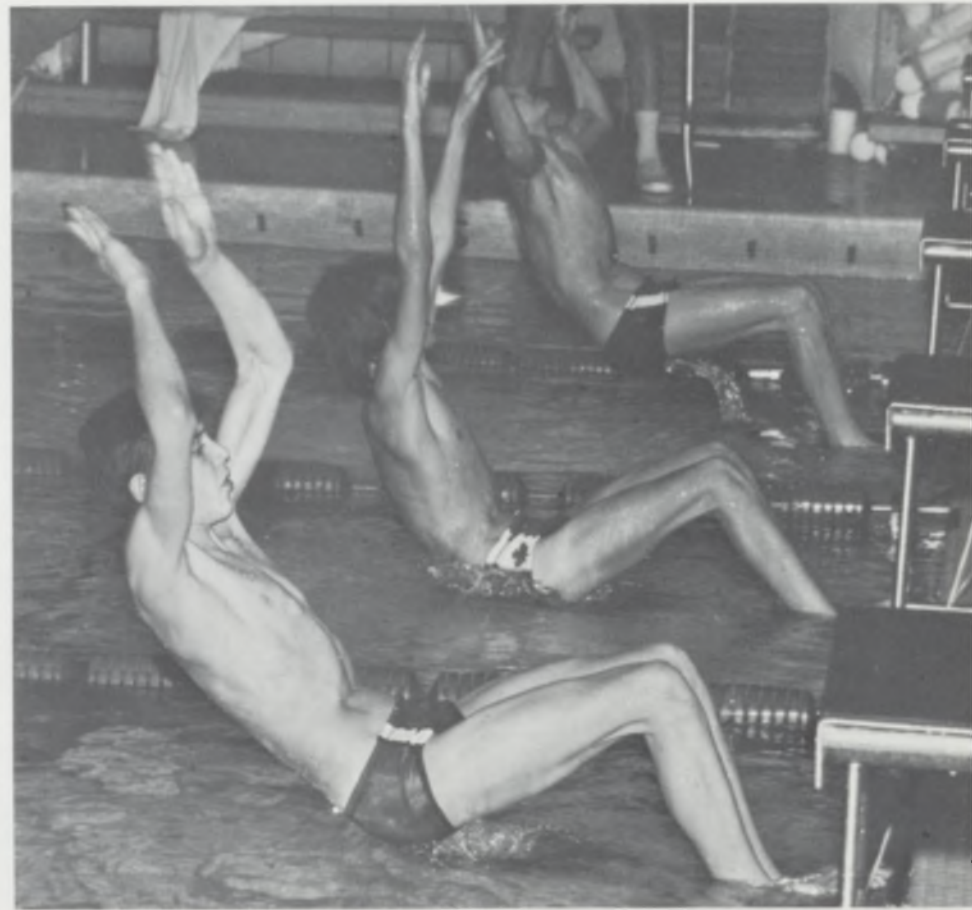

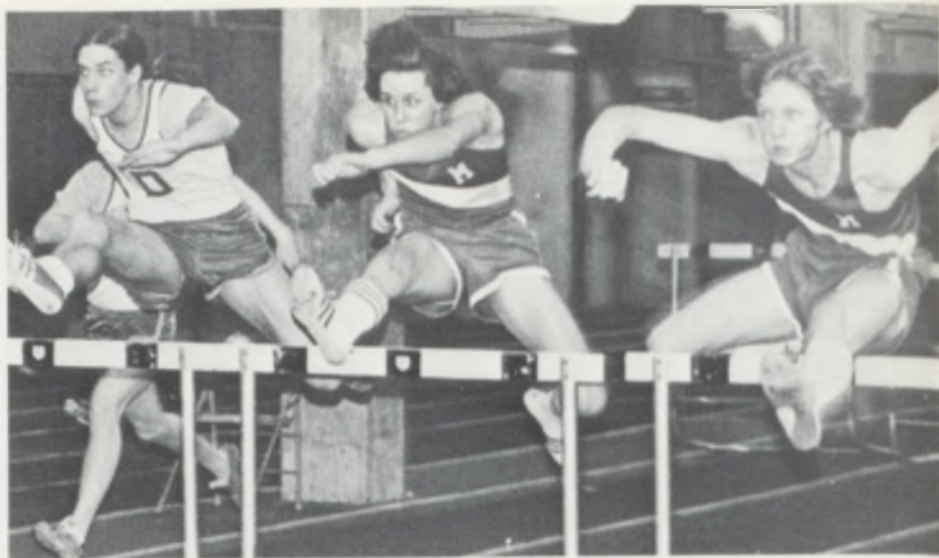
# INDOOR TRACK

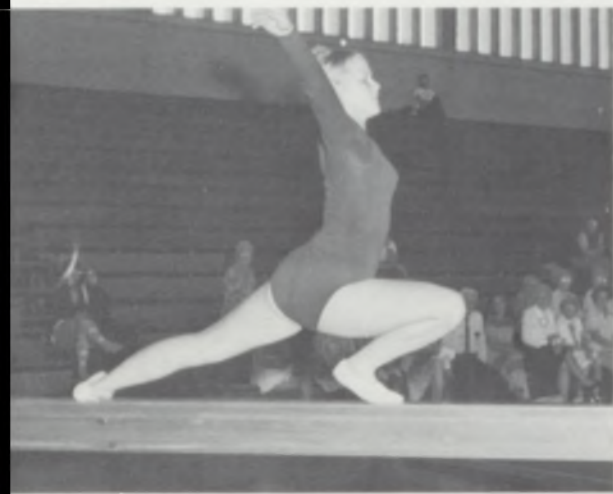

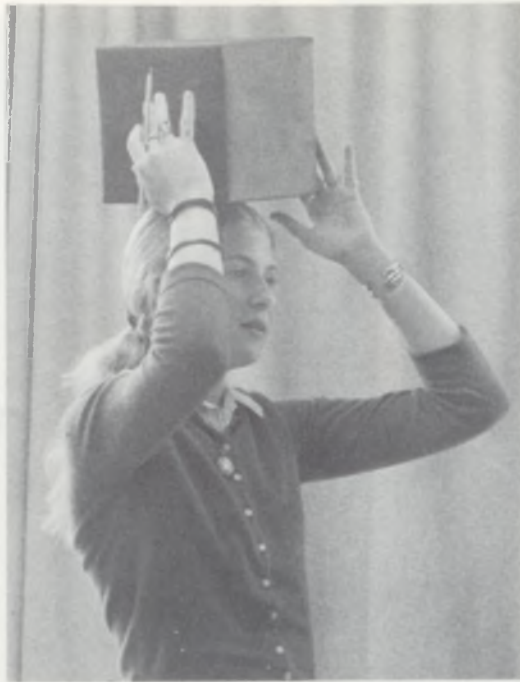
