



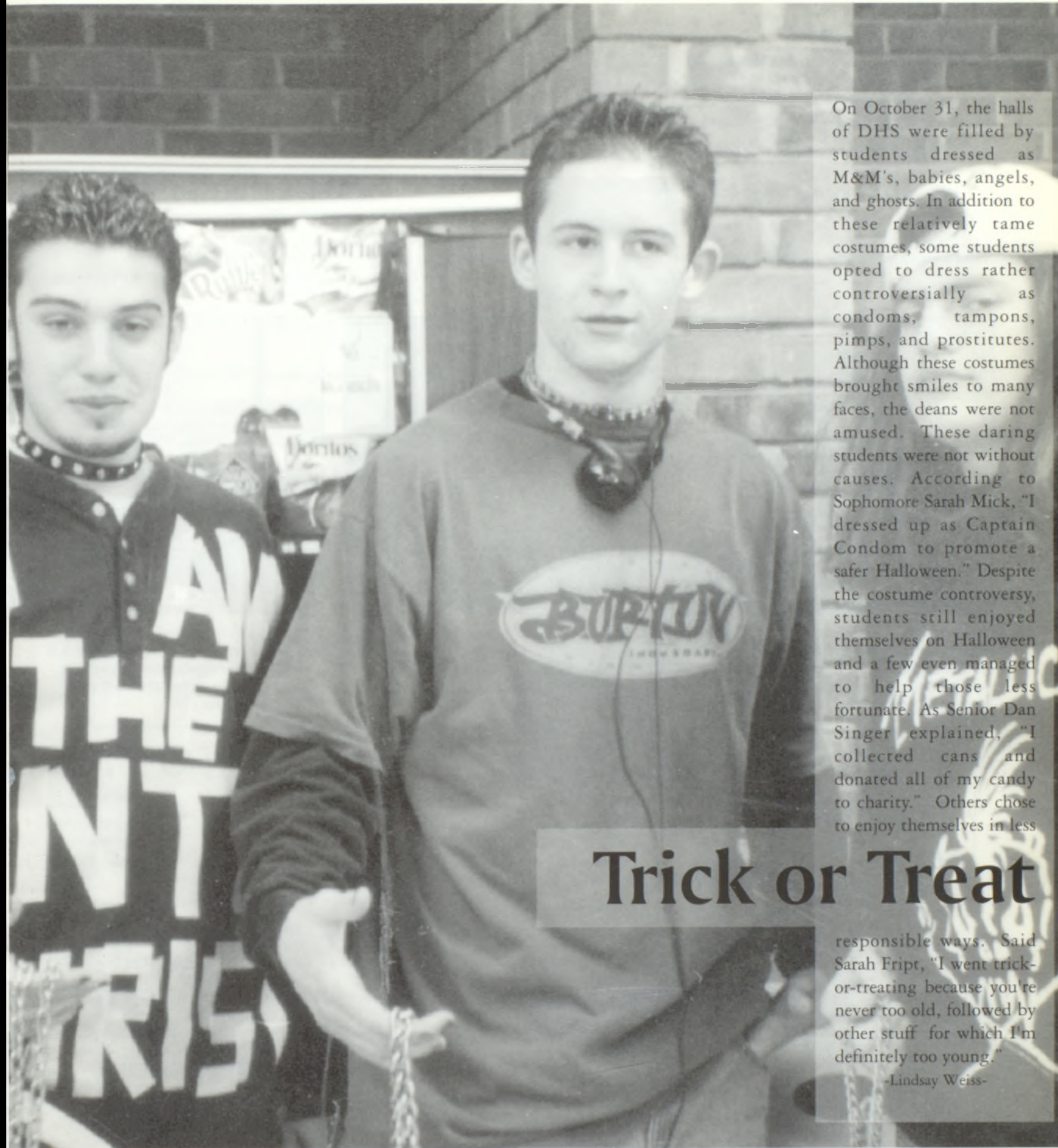

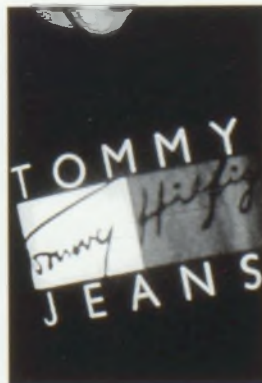

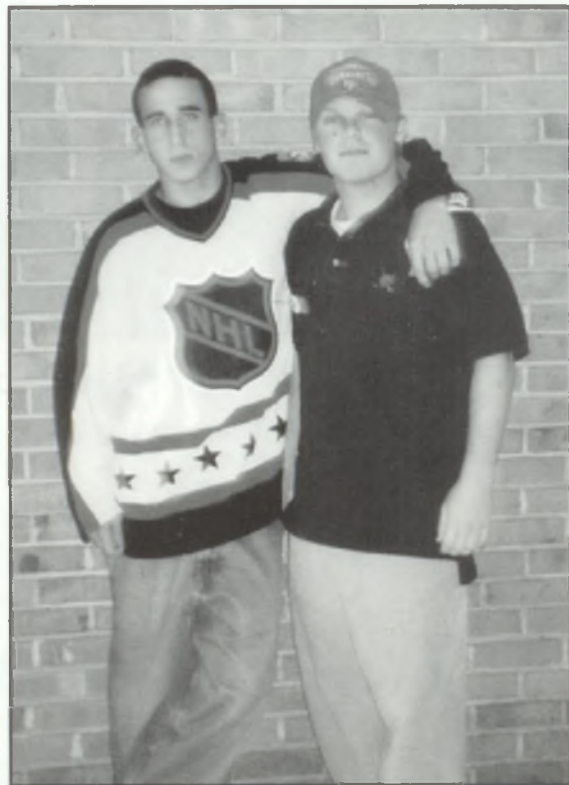
NAKED UNDER

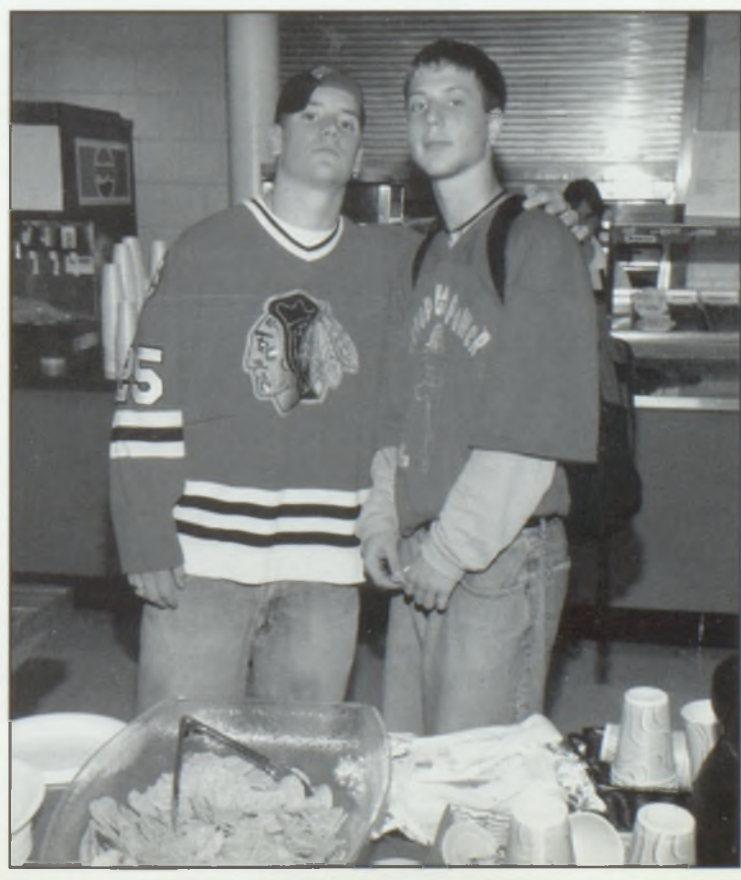

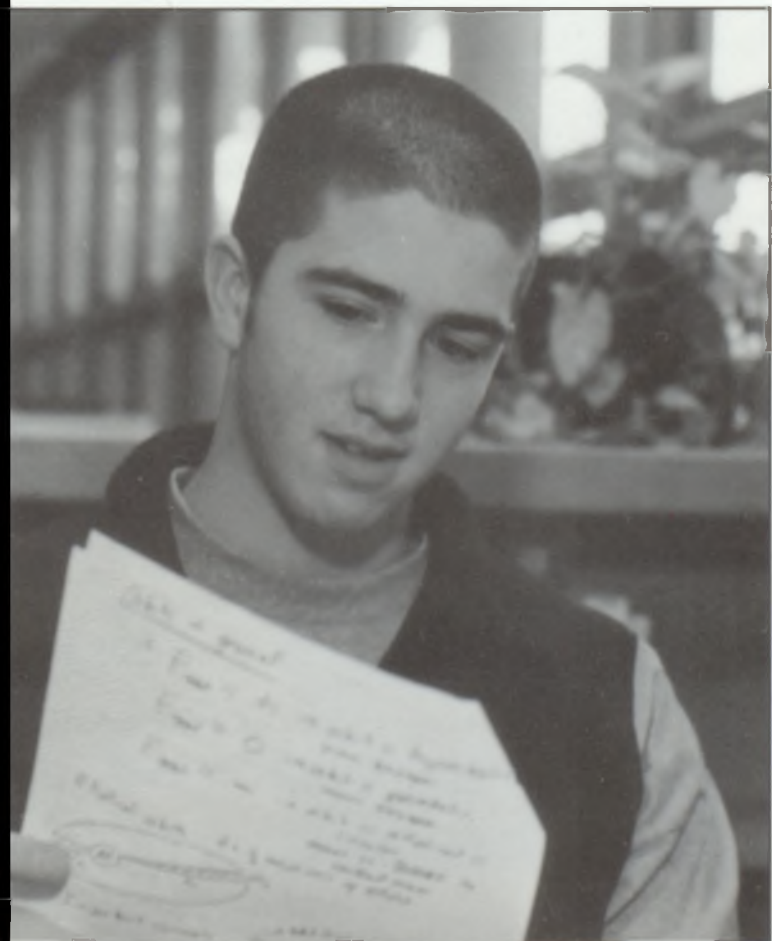

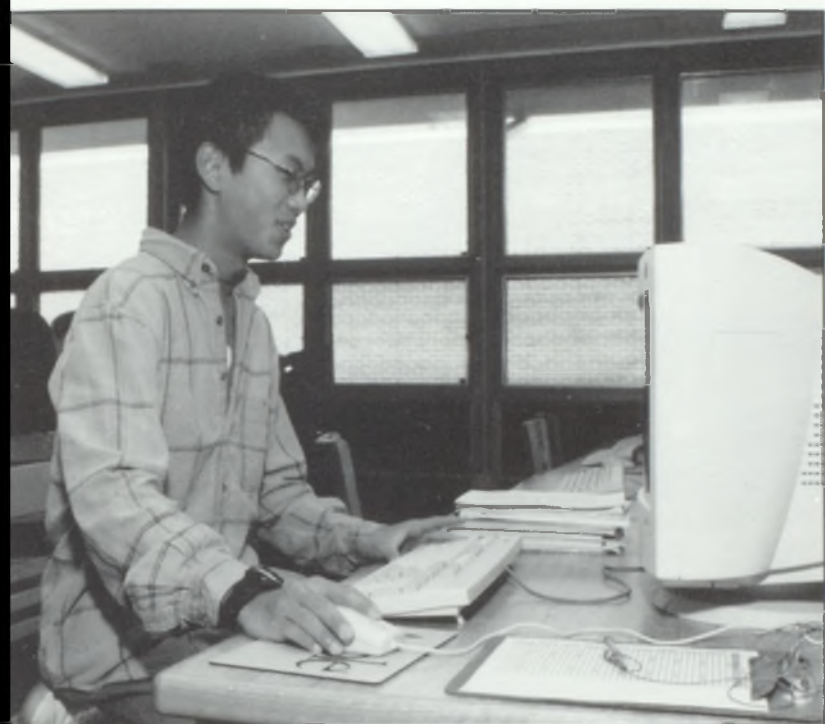
deerfield is a **high-tech** school with the newest, fastest, technology always available for students' use. 1997

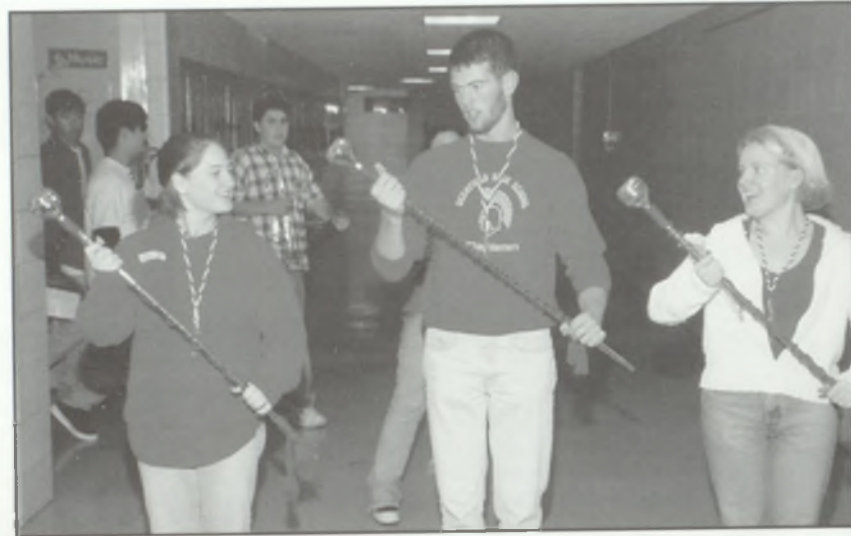


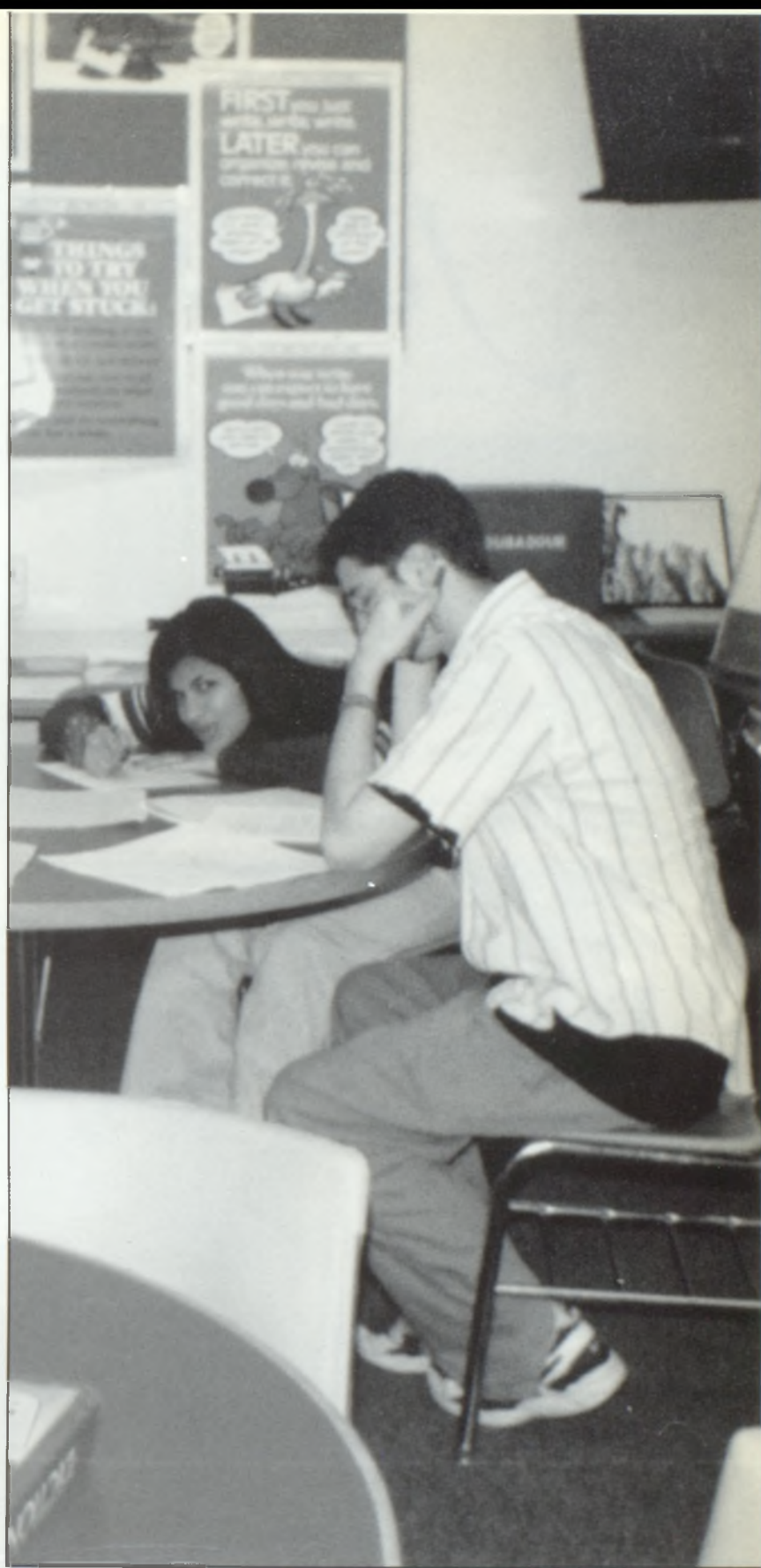

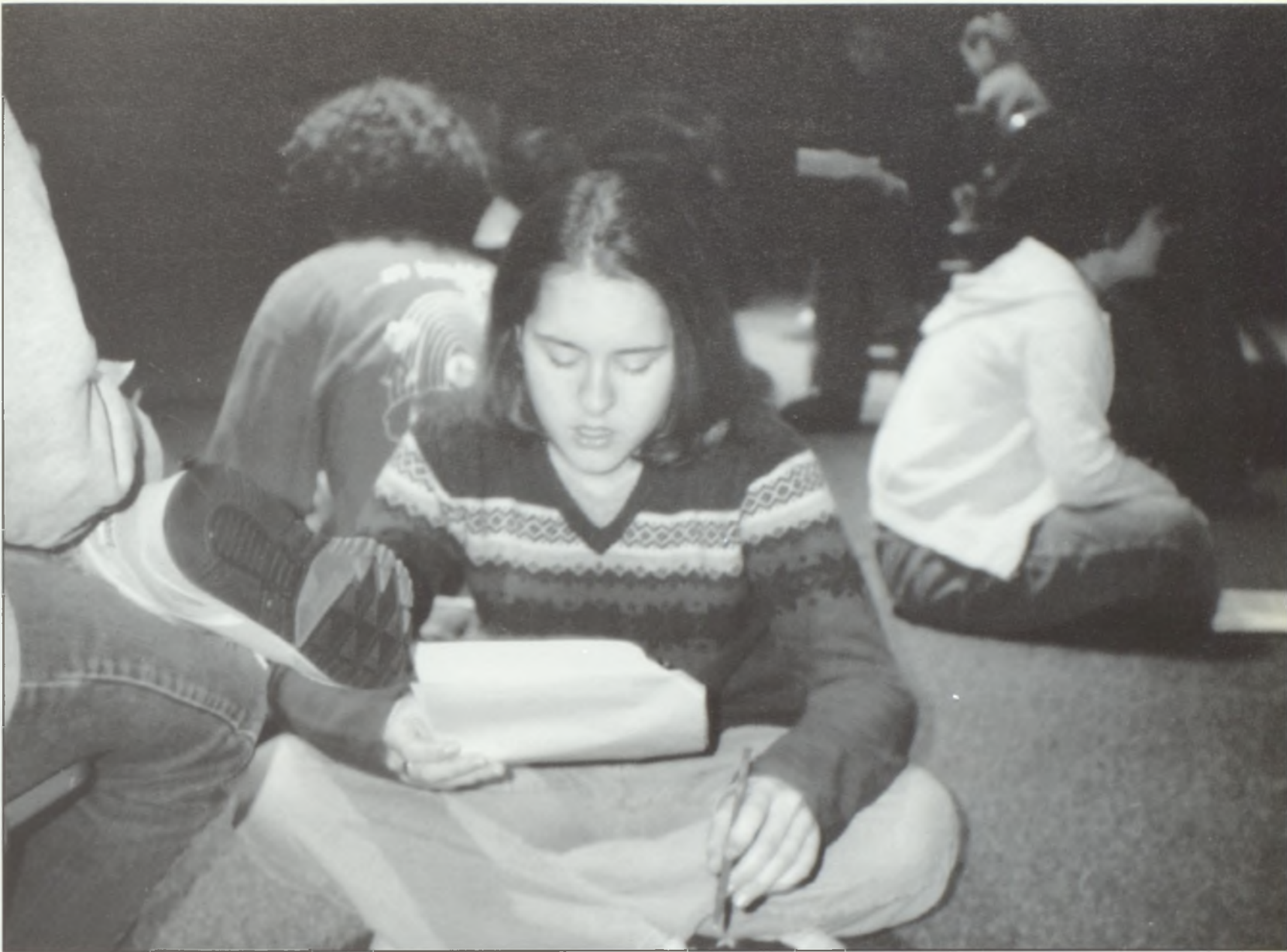
The Art club is in charge of making the sets for the musical, as well as pursuing their own art interests, with the help of Mr. Bleck. They also participate in various art exhibitions.

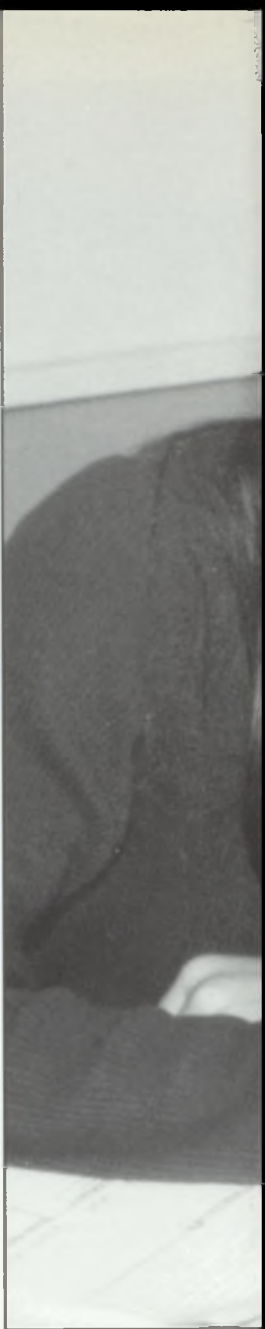

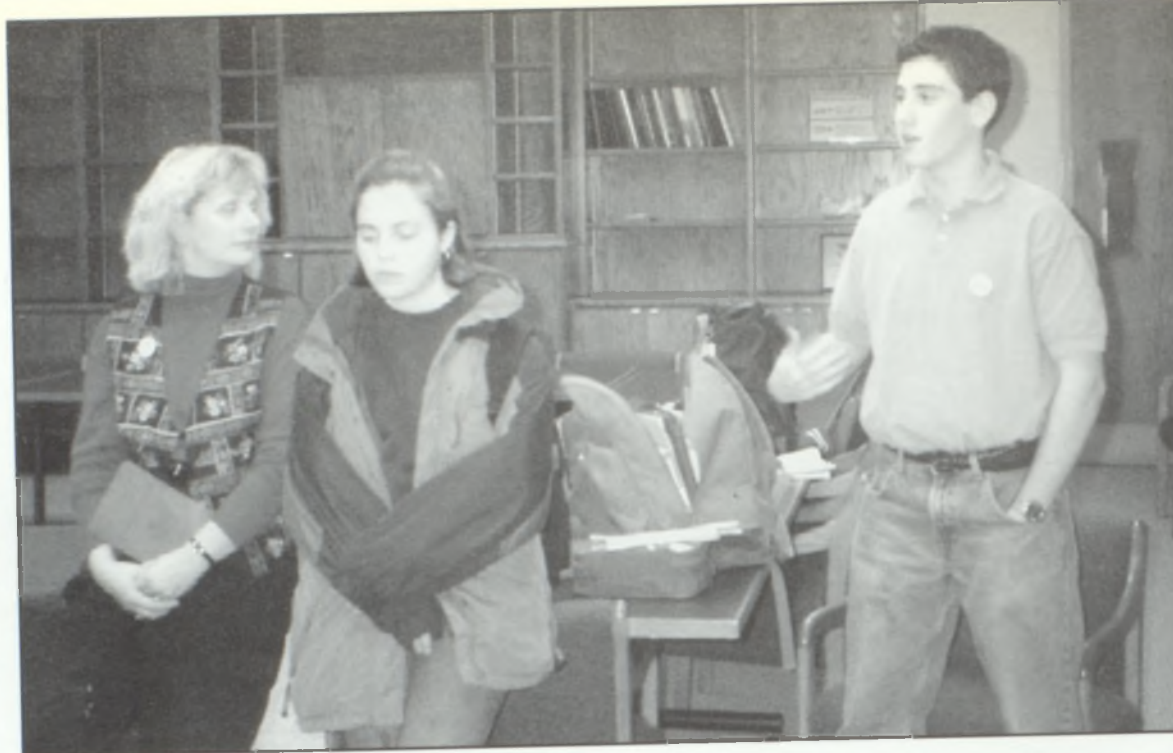

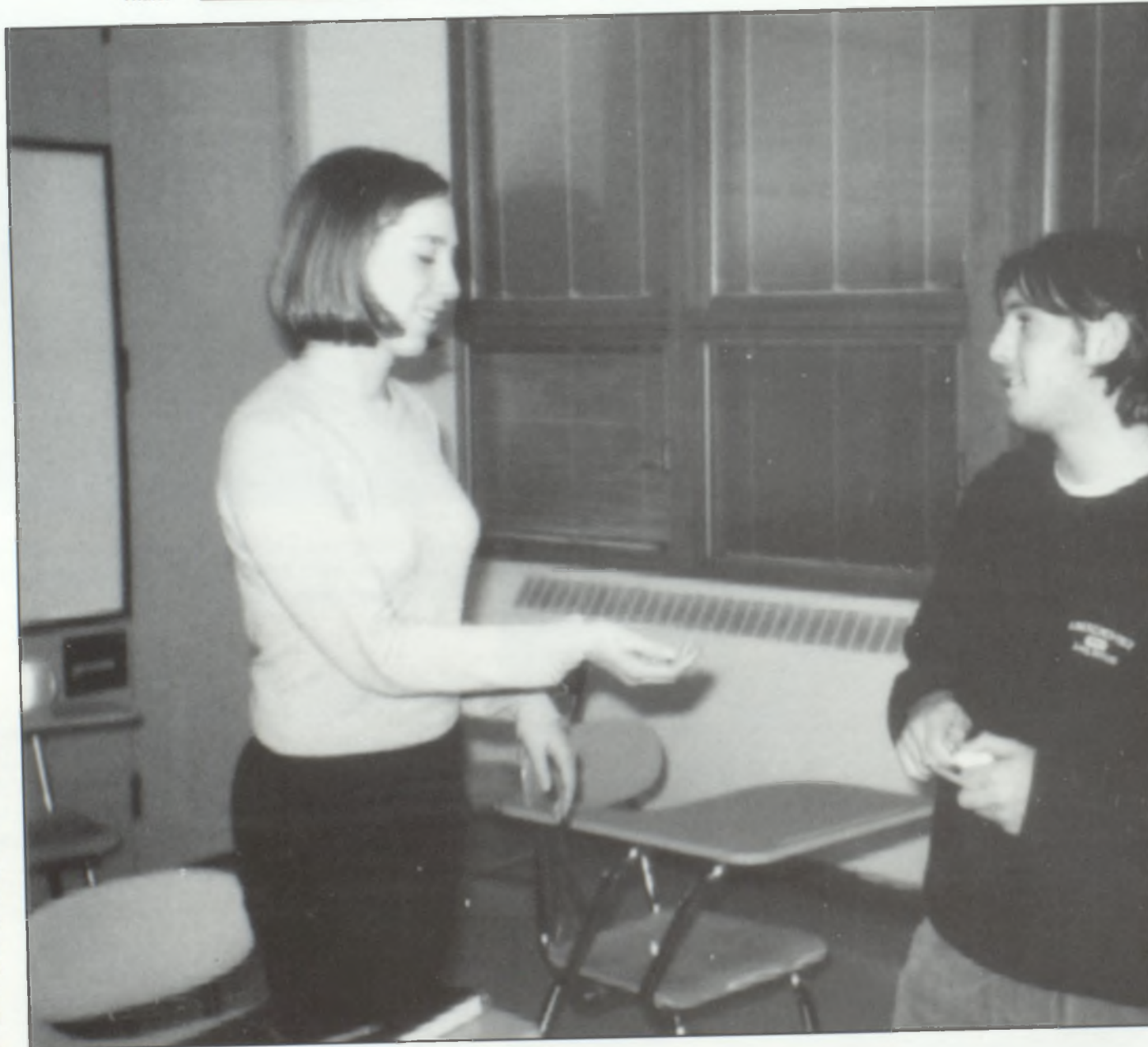

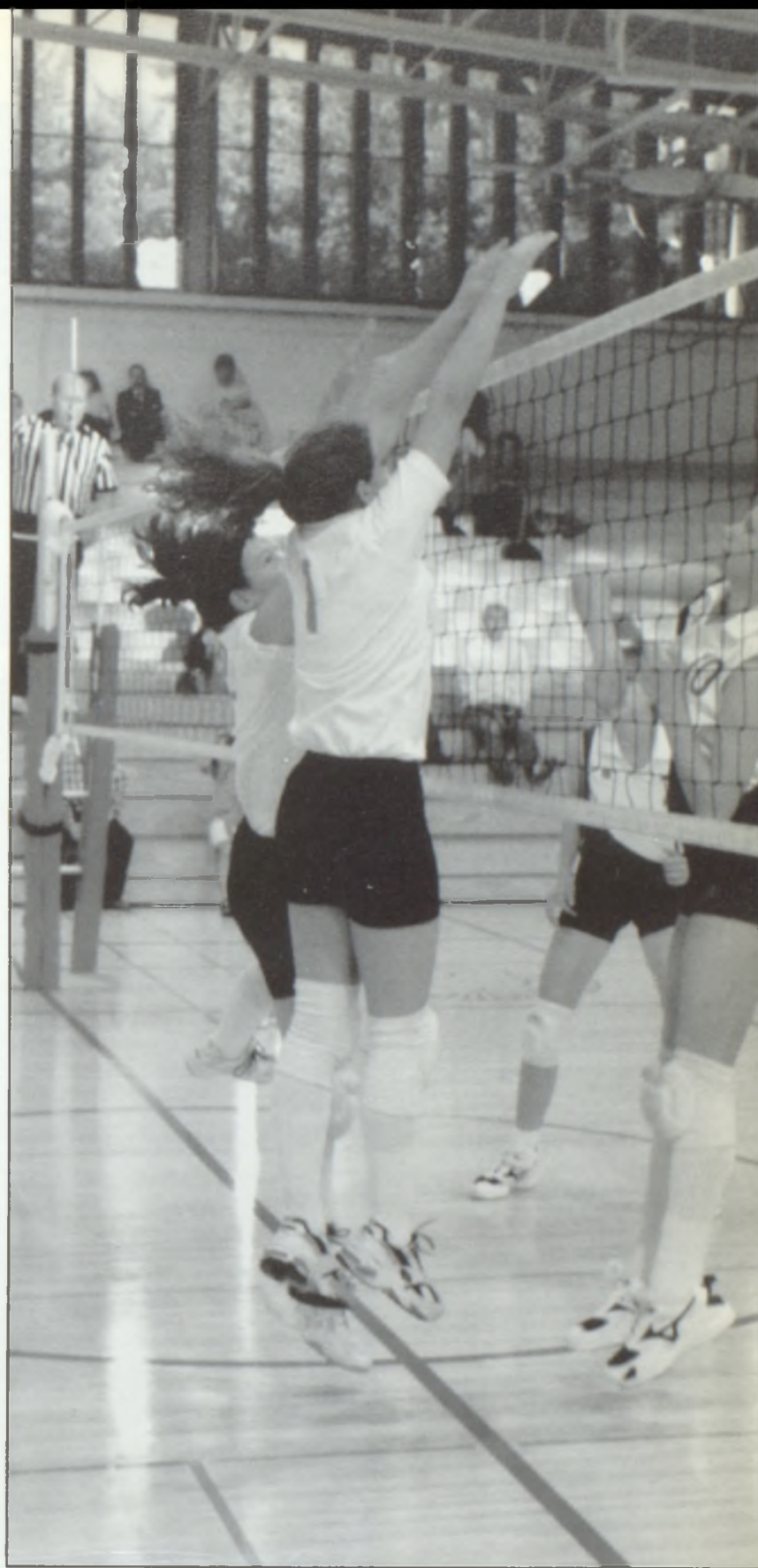

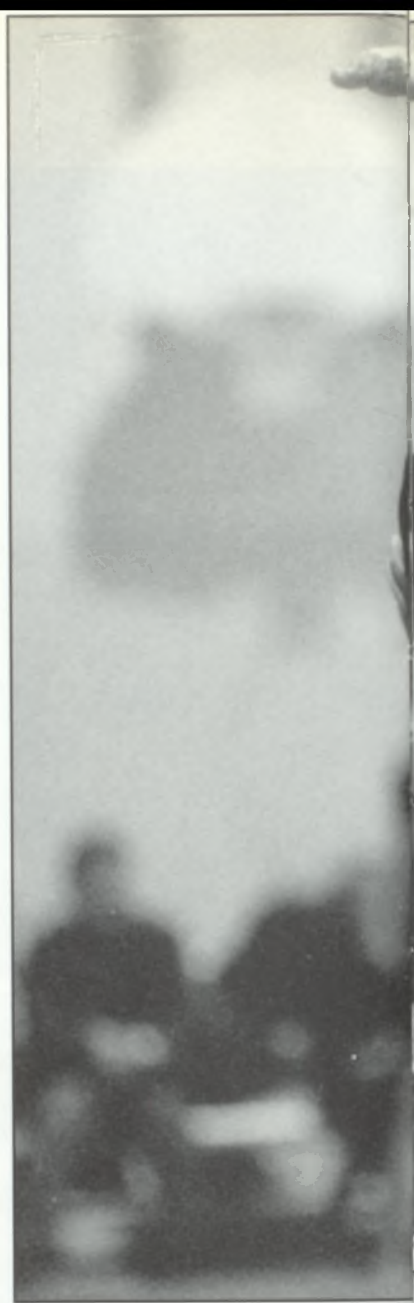


T O T H E B E A M S A N D B E Y O N D

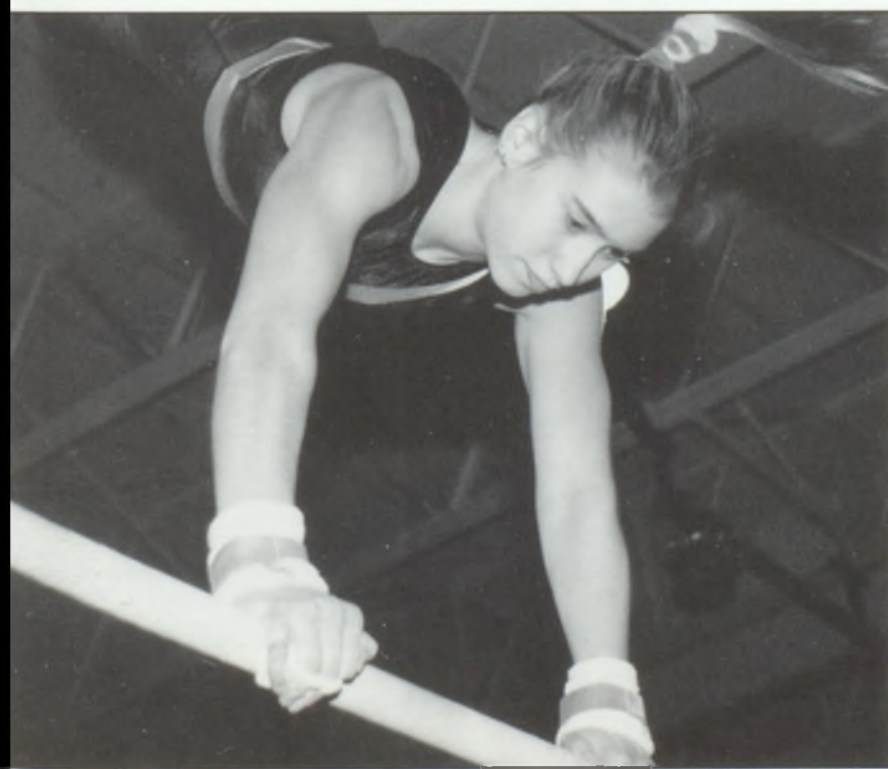
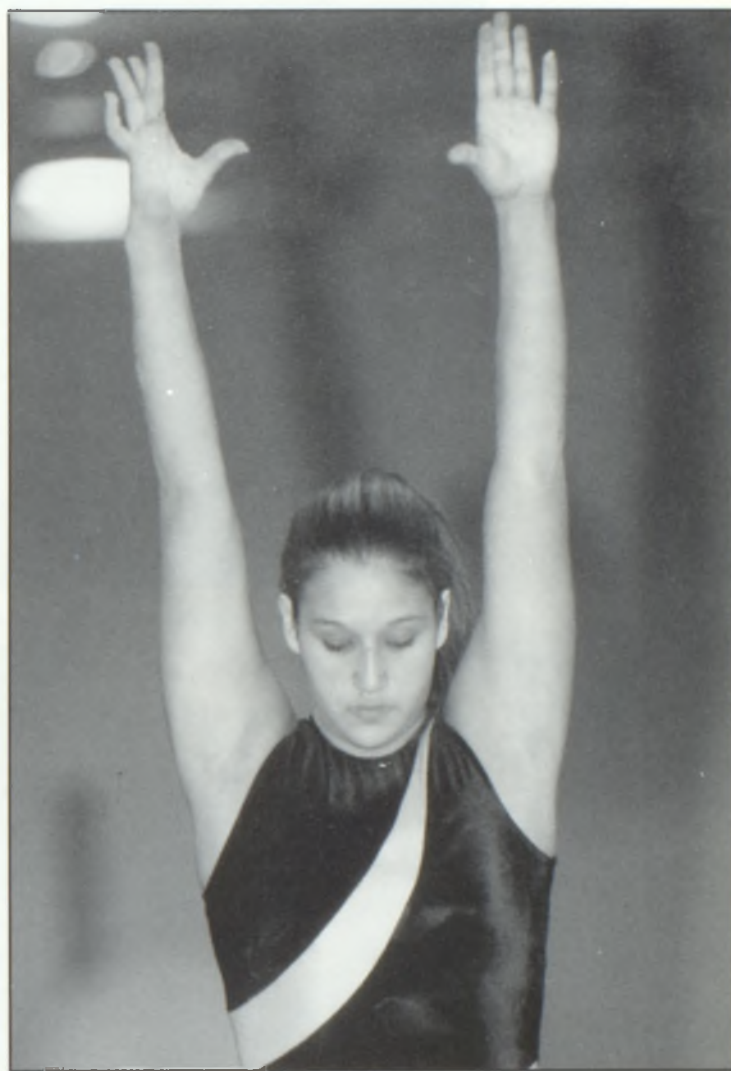

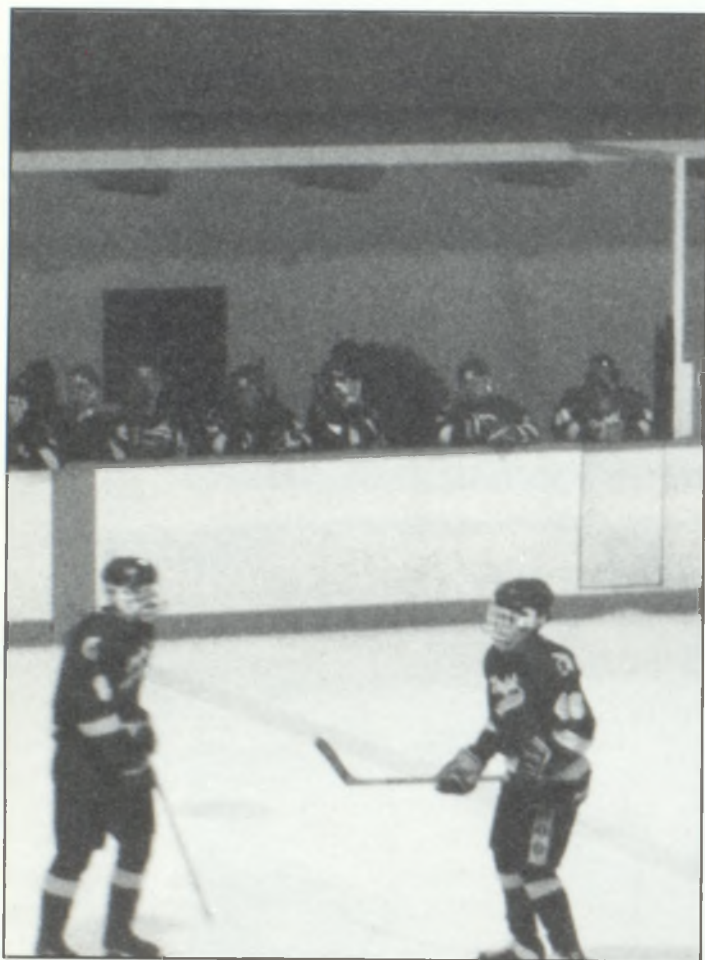

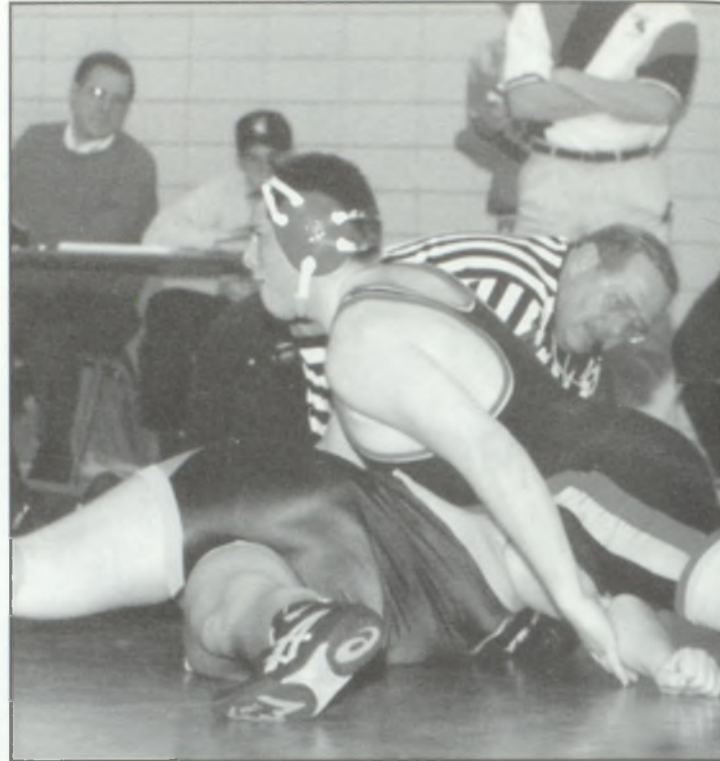

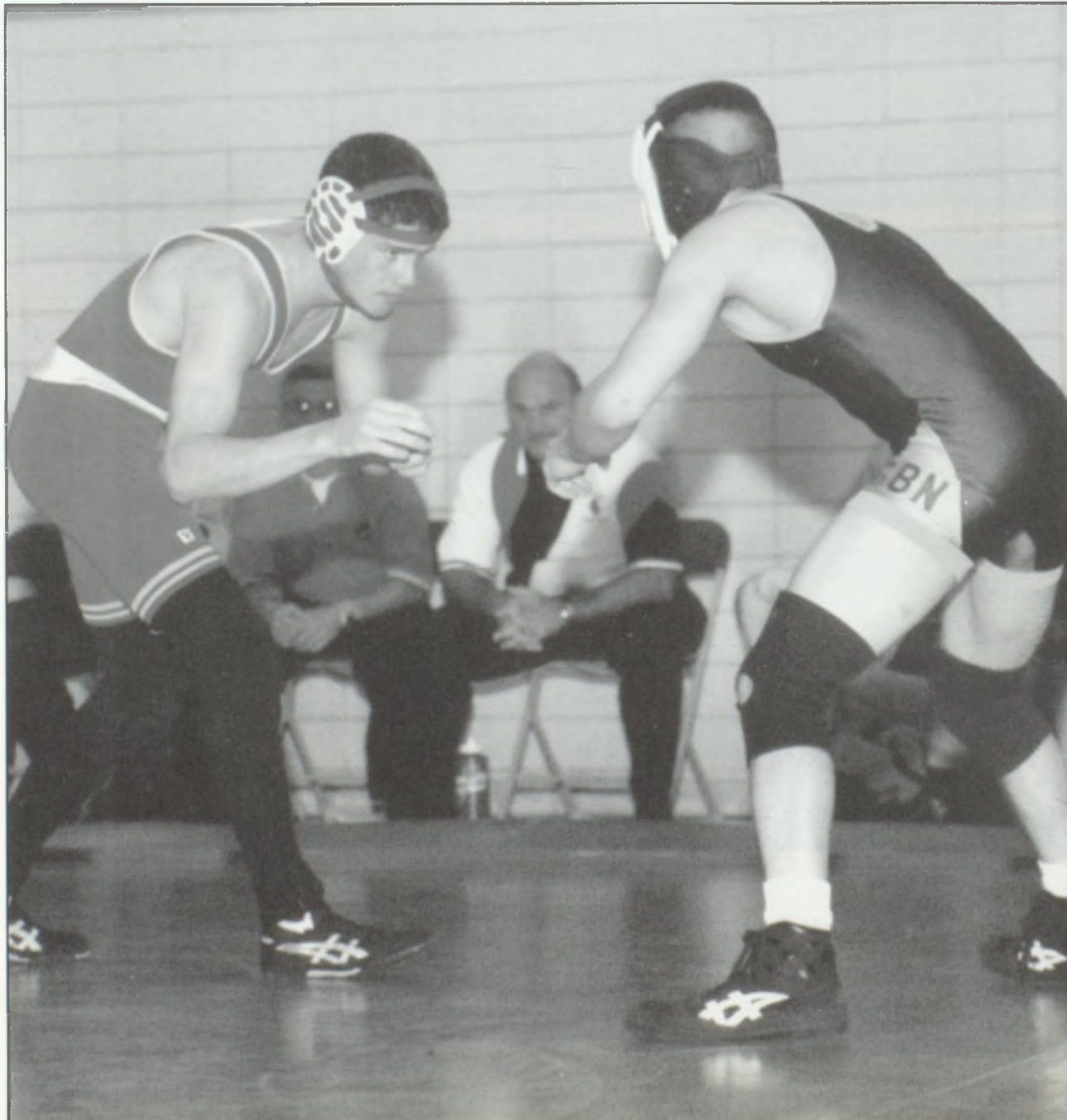

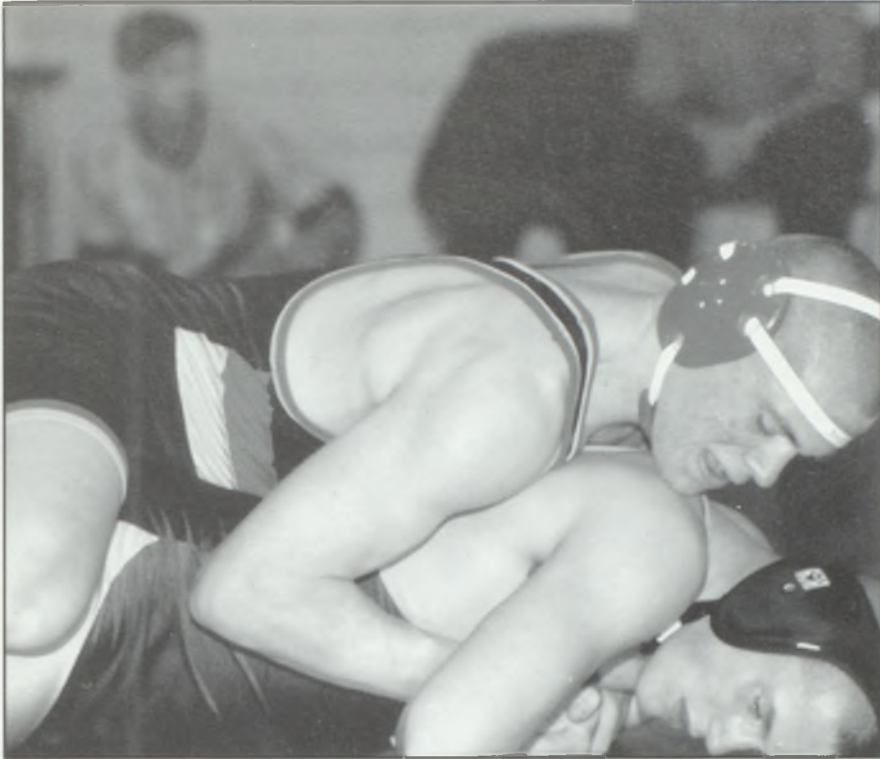

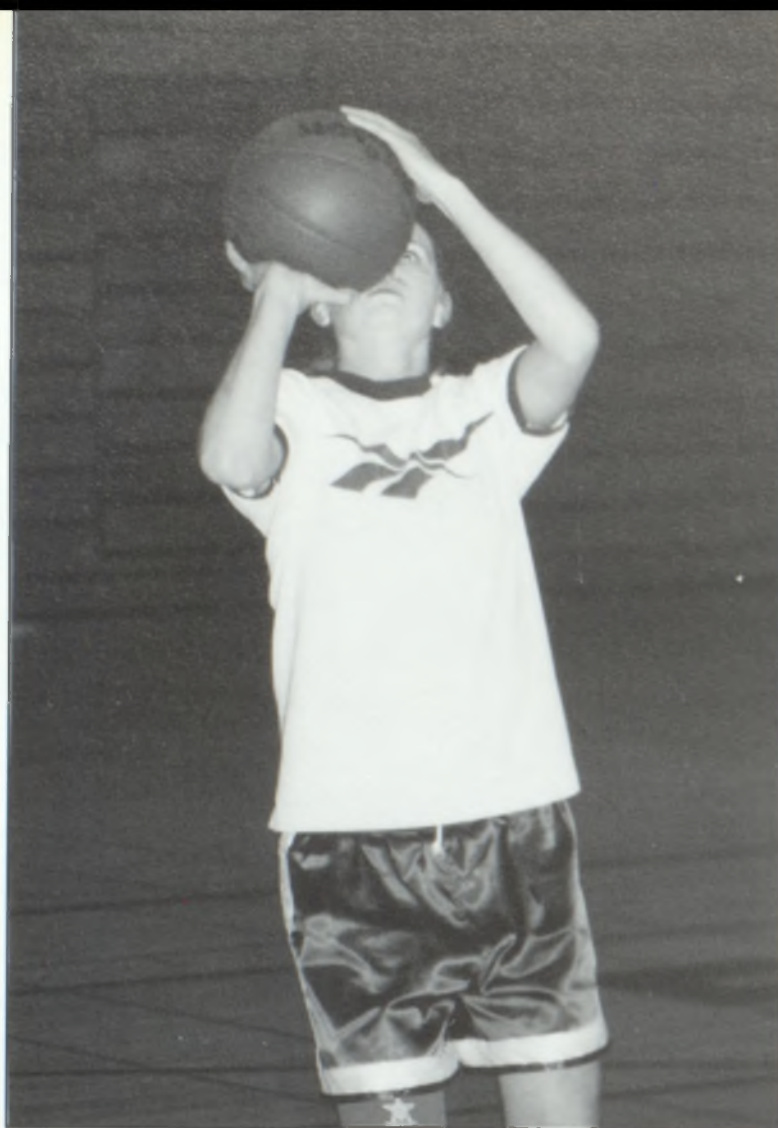
