Ffor the most part, Deerfield remained the peaceful North Shore suburb that it has been for over the past few years. Weekend activities were limited to movies, bowling, or shopping unless one ventured to neighboring suburbs or Chicago. Big, open parties were popular, usually taking place when the host's par~ ents were away. Many of Deerfield's early high school and junior high boys spent their weekends vandalizing. Deerfield's vandalism rate was exceptionally high. Reasons for vandalizing were boredom, thrills, and trying to get one's destruction mentioned in the Deerfield Review. The battle over whether or not to tear down

the ancient train station ended with the landmark remaining, but it was reconstructed. Northbrook Court, a huge new shopping center, opened and Lake-Cook Road had to be widened. This caused many detours and excessive traffic and traffic jams in uptown Deerfield and along Waukegan Road. Governor Walker announced that when his term was over, he would return to his home in Deerfield. But to most high school students, events such as these meant little; and for them, Deerfield was a typically boring and ordinary part of suburbia.
